A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TRAFFIC VIOLATIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that section 291C-172,
- 2 Hawaii Revised Statutes, regarding refusal to provide
- 3 identification, does not adequately address situations in which
- 4 the violator of a traffic law is stopped by a police officer and
- 5 refuses to provide any personal identifying information, or
- 6 provides obviously false information. Currently, this section
- 7 only allows a law enforcement officer to issue a citation for
- 8 this violation. However, if the violator is not providing the
- 9 officer with their identifying information, a citation cannot be
- 10 issued, making this law impractical. This impracticality
- 11 hinders law enforcement in the performance of the critical duty
- 12 of traffic enforcement, especially in relation to pedestrians or
- 13 bicycles. It is critical that police officers have the option
- 14 to arrest a violator of section 291C-172, Hawaii Revised
- 15 Statutes, when the person refuses to identify themselves, as a
- 16 deterrent to this type of behavior.

- 1 The legislature further finds that section 291C-23, Hawaii
- 2 Revised Statutes, regarding obedience to police officers, covers
- 3 similar traffic situations in which a person wilfully fails or
- 4 refuses to comply with any lawful order or direction of a police
- 5 officer who is controlling traffic. Violating section 291C-23,
- 6 Hawaii Revised Statutes, is a petty misdemeanor.
- 7 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to amend section
- 8 291C-172, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to change the penalty for
- 9 violation of this section from a traffic infraction to a petty
- 10 misdemeanor. This adjustment will allow a functional
- 11 progression for officers to follow in the event a traffic law
- 12 violator refuses to provide a police officer with their
- 13 information.
- 14 SECTION 2. Section 291C-172, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 15 amended to read as follows:
- 16 "\$291C-172 Refusal to provide identification. (a) Except
- 17 as provided in subsection (b), any person detained for a
- 18 violation of this chapter shall provide the person's name and
- 19 address[, or], and any proof thereof, [or both,] upon the lawful
- 20 order or direction of any police officer in the course and scope
- 21 of the officer's duties pursuant to this chapter.

H.B. NO. H.D. 1

- 1 (b) A pedestrian who is detained for violating part VII of
- 2 this chapter shall provide the person's name and address upon
- 3 the lawful order or direction of a police officer in the course
- 4 and scope of the officer's duties. If the officer has
- 5 reasonable grounds to believe that the person is being deceptive
- 6 or misleading in providing the person's name and address, the
- 7 person shall provide such proof thereof, upon the lawful order
- 8 or direction of the police officer.
- 9 (c) Refusal to provide identification is a petty
- 10 misdemeanor."
- 11 SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 12 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 13 begun before its effective date.
- 14 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 15 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 16 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2222.
