# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE WITHDRAWAL OF PETITION SIGNATURES.

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:**

1           SECTION 1. Section 11-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is  
2 amended to read as follows:

3           " ~~[+] §11-6 [+]~~  **Petitions; withdrawal of signatures.**

4           Wherever in this chapter the signatures of registered voters are  
5 required on a petition, any voter who, after signing a petition,  
6 seeks to withdraw the voter's signature may do so by providing  
7 notice in writing to the chief election officer any time before  
8 the filing of the petition. The notice shall include ~~[the name,~~  
9 ~~social security number, address, and birthdate of the voter and~~  
10 ~~must be signed by the voter with the name under which the voter~~  
11 ~~is registered to vote.] the voter's name, residence address, the~~  
12 ~~month and date portions of the voter's date of birth, the~~  
13 ~~voter's signature, and a statement that the voter wishes to~~  
14 ~~remove the voter's signature from the petition; provided that~~  
15 ~~the written notice shall not require the voter's social security~~  
16 ~~number or any portion thereof and the year portion of the~~  
17 ~~voter's date of birth.~~ Upon receipt of that notice containing



1 the information required by this section, the chief election  
2 officer shall notify the group or individual to whom the  
3 petition was issued and the signature of the individual shall  
4 not be counted."

5 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed  
6 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

7 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
