A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MANDATORY ETHICS TRAINING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that requiring all state
- 2 officers and employees to be educated on the state ethics code
- 3 is in the best interests of the State. Regular training by the
- 4 state ethics commission will ensure that state employees are
- 5 aware of current ethics laws, and will increase the public's
- 6 confidence in state government.
- 7 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to establish an
- 8 online ethics training course to be designed and administered by
- 9 the state ethics commission and to make ethics training
- $10\,$ mandatory for all state officers and employees.
- 11 SECTION 2. Section 84-42, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 12 amended to read as follows:
- "[{--]\$84-42[}] Mandatory ethics training course. [All-
- 14 state officers and employees enumerated in section 84-41] (a)
- 15 Legislators, members of the board of education, trustees of the
- 16 office of Hawaiian affairs, the governor, the lieutenant
- 17 governor, executive department heads and deputies, and every



1 other person whose financial disclosure statement is a public 2 record pursuant to section 84-17(d) shall complete [an] a live 3 ethics training course administered by the state ethics 4 commission [as provided in this part. For the purposes of this 5 part, "ethics training" includes education and training in: 6 (1) The ethics laws set forth in this chapter; and 7 (2) The lobbying laws set forth in chapter 97. within ninety days of taking office and at least once every 8 9 four years thereafter. 10 (b) All other employees shall complete either a live or an 11 online ethics training course administered by the state ethics commission within ninety days of becoming an employee and at 12 least once every four years thereafter." 13 14 SECTION 3. Section 84-43, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 15 amended to read as follows: 16 "§84-43 Ethics training [course.] courses; live and **17** online. (a) The state ethics commission shall establish, 18 design, supervise, and conduct live and online ethics training 19 courses for [the officers] all legislators and employees [to 20 whom this part applies].

15	explanation	ons, discussions, and examples of the practical
16	applicati	on of ethics laws and principles as the ethics
17	commissio	n deems appropriate. The state ethics commission shall
18	develop t	he methods and prepare any materials necessary to
19	implement	the online ethics training course.
20	[-(c)] (d) The state ethics commission shall:
21	(1)	Administer the ethics training [course;

1	(2)	Designate those of its legal staff who are to conduct
2		the <u>live</u> ethics training course; [and]
3	(3)	Notify each [officer] legislator or employee
4		[enumerated in section 84-41], either directly or via
5		the employee's employing agency, that their attendance
6		or participation in [this] an applicable ethics
7		training course is mandatory[-], provided that a
8		legislator's or employee's non-receipt of notice shall
9		not be a defense to a charge concerning a violation of
10		this chapter; and
11	(4)	Design and administer the online ethics training
12		course.

14	course as	necessary to accommodate all persons who are required

         SECTION 5. Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, all

    state legislators and employees who are in active service on the
    effective date of this Act shall successfully complete an online

    months following the effective date of this Act and at least

    once every four years thereafter; provided that the requirement

    to successfully complete an ethics training course within the

    twelve month period immediately following the effective date of

    this Act shall not apply to those state legislators or employees

    who, within the past three years from the effective date of this

    Act, have successfully completed an online or live ethics

    training course, as applicable.

Report Title:

Hawaii State Ethics Commission Package; Ethics Code; Live and Online Classes; Mandatory Training

Description:

Requires all new state employees to complete ethics training either live or online within 90 days of the start of employment and every 4 years thereafter. Requires existing employees who have not received ethics training within the immediately preceding 3 years to complete live or online ethics training within 12 months of the Act's effective date and at least once every 4 years thereafter. Specifies that certain state officers shall complete live ethics training.
