

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FIREWORKS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the use of consumer
- 2 fireworks causes fires and burn injuries, mostly to children.
- 3 Fireworks produce excessive smoke that makes breathing
- 4 difficult. Noise from loud fireworks traumatizes many
- 5 residents, including war veterans and pets. With the increase
- 6 in fireworks-related calls, public safety agencies are strained
- 7 to maintain adequate response levels for other critical
- $oldsymbol{8}$ emergencies. The legislature further finds that people in the
- 9 State and its communities deserve to live in peace and security
- 10 without the public safety risk and disruptive impact of
- 11 fireworks.
- 12 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to limit the use of
- 13 consumer fireworks by:
- 14 (1) Authorizing the sale and use of consumer fireworks
- only for cultural purposes; and

1	(2) Discontinuing the authorization of the non-cultur	al
2	use of consumer fireworks on New Year's Eve, the	
3	Fourth of July, and Chinese New Year's Day.	
4	The legislature notes that this Act is not intended to	
5	prohibit the use by licensed professionals of display firew	orks,
6	articles pyrotechnic, and aerial devices.	
7	SECTION 2. Section 132D-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, i	S
8	amended as follows:	
9	1. By amending the definition of "consumer fireworks"	to
10	read:	
11	""Consumer fireworks" [means]:	
12	(1) Means any fireworks designed primarily for retail	sale
13	to the public [during authorized dates and times,]
14	that produces visible or audible effects by	
15	combustion, and that is designed to remain on or	near
16	the ground and, while stationary or spinning raps	idly
17	on or near the ground, emits smoke, a shower of	
18	colored sparks, whistling effects, flitter sparks	s, or
19	balls of colored sparks, and includes combination	ì
20	items that contain one or more of these effects.	
21	"Consumer fireworks" shall comply with the	

1		construction, chemical composition, and labeling
2		regulations of the United States Consumer Product
3		Safety Commission as set forth in Title 16 Code of
4		Federal Regulations and fireworks classified as UN0336
5		and UN0337 by the United States Department of
6		Transportation as set forth in Title 49 Code of
7		Federal Regulations[. "Consumer fireworks" include
8		<pre>firework items]; and</pre>
9	(2)	Includes fireworks commonly known as firecrackers that
10		are single paper cylinders not exceeding one and one-
11		half inches in length excluding the fuse and one-
12		quarter of an inch in diameter and contain a charge of
13		not more than fifty milligrams of pyrotechnic
14		composition, snakes, sparklers, fountains, and
15		cylindrical or cone fountains that emit effects up to
16		a height not greater than twelve feet above the
17		ground, illuminating torches, bamboo cannons,

whistles, toy smoke devices, wheels, and ground

spinners that when ignited remain within a circle with

a radius of twelve feet as measured from the point

where the item was placed and ignited, novelty or

1	trick items, combination items, and other fireworks of
2	like construction that are designed to produce the
3	same or similar effects."
4	2. By amending the definition of "cultural" to read:
5	""Cultural" means relating to the arts, customs,
6	traditions, mores, and history of $[all of]$ the various ethnic
7	groups of Hawaii[+] and includes religious events."
8	SECTION 3. Section 132D-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
9	amended to read as follows:
10	"§132D-3 [Permissible uses] <u>Use</u> of consumer fireworks[-
11	Consumer fireworks may be]; prohibition; exceptions. It shall
12	be unlawful for any person to set off, [ignited, discharged, or
13	otherwise caused] ignite, discharge, or otherwise cause to
14	explode within the State [only:
15	(1) From 9:00 p.m. on New Year's Eve to 1:00 a.m. on New
16	Year's Day; from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. on Chinese New
17	Year's Day; and from 1:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. on the
18	Fourth of July; or
19	(2) From] any consumer fireworks, except for the purposes
20	of a cultural event from 9:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. as
21	allowed by permit pursuant to section 132D-10 [if the



1	Ŧ	proposed cultural use is to occur at any time other
2	4	than during the periods prescribed in paragraph (1)];
3	provided th	nat the purchase of not more than five thousand
4	individual	consumer fireworks commonly known as firecrackers
5	shall be al	llowed under each permit."
6	SECTIO	ON 4. Section 132D-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
7	amended to	read as follows:
8	"§132I	O-5 General prohibitions. (a) [It] In addition to
9	the prohib:	ition under section 132D-3, it shall be unlawful for
10	any person	[without a permit issued under section 132D-10 by a
11	county fire	e department] to:
12	(1) I	Remove or extract the pyrotechnic contents from any
13	=	fireworks;
14	(2)	Throw any ignited fireworks:
15		(A) From, at, or into a vehicle;
16		(B) At a person or an animal; and
17		(C) From above the first floor of any building; or
18	(3)	Set off, ignite, discharge, or otherwise cause to
19	•	explode any fireworks:
20		(A) Above the first floor of any building;
21		(B) In any vehicle;

1	[-(C)-	At any time not within the periods for use
2		prescribed in section 132D-3;
3	(D) -]	(C) Within one thousand feet of any operating
4		hospital, licensed convalescent home, licensed
5		home for the elderly, zoo, licensed animal
6		shelter, or licensed animal hospital;
7	[-(E) -]	(D) In any school building, or on any school
8		grounds and yards without first obtaining
9		authorization from appropriate school officials;
10	[-(F) -]	(E) On any highway, alley, street, sidewalk, or
11		other public way; in any park; on any public
12		beach; in any officially designated forest or
13		wildlife preserve; within fifty feet of a
14		canefield; or within one thousand feet of any
15		building used for public worship during the
16		periods when services are held; and
17	[-(G) -]	(F) Within five hundred feet of any hotel.
18	(b) [It]	Except for use at a cultural event by permit
19	pursuant to se	ction 132D-10, it shall be unlawful to purchase or
20	possess consum	er fireworks [more than five calendar days before

1 the time periods for permissible use under section 132D-3.] 2 within the State. 3 [#t] Except for use at a cultural event by permit 4 pursuant to section 132D-10, it shall be unlawful to offer, 5 expose for sale, sell, or furnish consumer fireworks [after 6 12:01 a.m. on New Year's Day, 6:00 p.m. on Chinese New Year's 7 Day, and 8:00 p.m. on the Fourth of July.] to any person within 8 the State." 9 SECTION 5. Section 132D-8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 10 amended by amending subsection (d) to read as follows: "(d) It shall be unlawful for any licensee, other than a 11 12 wholesaler who is selling or transferring fireworks or articles 13 pyrotechnic to a licensed retailer, to sell or offer to sell, 14 exchange for consideration, give, transfer, or donate any 15 fireworks or articles pyrotechnic at any time to any person who 16 does not present a permit duly issued as required by section 132D-10 or 132D-16. The permit shall be signed by the seller or 17 18 transferor at the time of sale or transfer of the fireworks or 19 articles pyrotechnic, and the seller or transferor shall 20 indicate on the permit the amount and type of fireworks or 21

articles pyrotechnic sold or transferred. No person shall sell

1	or delive	r fireworks to any permittee in any amount in excess of
2	the amoun	t specified in the permit, less the amount shown on the
3	permit to	have been previously purchased; provided that no
4	fireworks	shall be sold to a permittee holding a permit issued
5	for purpo	ses of section 132D-3, more than five calendar days
6	before th	e applicable [time period under section 132D-3.]
7	cultural	event."
8	SECT	ION 6. Section 132D-10, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
9	amended t	o read as follows:
10	"§13	2D-10 Permits[-] for the purchase and use of
11	fireworks	_ A permit shall be required for the purchase and use
12	of:	
13	(1)	Any consumer fireworks [commonly known as firecrackers
14		upon payment of a fee of \$25;] for cultural events,
15		the fee for which shall be \$25 per permit; and
16	(2)	Any aerial devices, display fireworks, or articles
17		pyrotechnic for the purposes of section 132D-16 [upon
18		payment of a fee of \$110; and
19	(3)	Any consumer fireworks for the purposes of section
20		132D-5 or for cultural uses that occur at any time
21		other than during the periods prescribed in section

1	132D-3(1) upon a payment of a fee of \$25.], the fee
2	for which shall be \$110 per permit."
3	SECTION 7. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
4	matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
5	begun before its effective date.
6	SECTION 8. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
7	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
8	SECTION 9. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
