A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SUNSCREEN.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 342D-21, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended to read as follows: "[+]\$342D-21[+] Sale and distribution of sunscreen 3 4 [containing oxybenzone or octinoxate, or both; prohibition.]; 5 active ingredients; generally recognized as safe and effective. 6 (a) [Beginning January 1, 2021, it] It shall be unlawful to 7 sell, offer for sale, or distribute for sale in the State any 8 sunscreen that contains [oxybenzone or octinoxate, or both,] 9 active ingredients that are not generally recognized as safe and 10 effective by the United States Food and Drug Administration, without a prescription issued by a licensed [healthcare] health 11 12 care provider. 13 (b) No county shall enact any ordinance or regulatory 14 restriction to prohibit the sale, use, labeling, packaging, 15 handling, distribution, or advertisement of sunscreens 16 containing oxybenzone or octinoxate, or both, prior to 17 January 1, 2021.
