

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TRAFFIC.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 291C, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by amending the title of part VIII to read as follows:
3	"PART VIII. TURNING [AND], STARTING, AND PROCEEDING AND
4	SIGNALS ON STOPPING [AND], TURNING, AND BICYCLE PROCEEDING"
5	SECTION 2. Section 291C-81, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
6	amended to read as follows:
7	"§291C-81 Required position and method of turning at
8	intersections[+]; bicycle proceeding through intersections. (a)
9	The driver of a vehicle intending to turn at an intersection
10	shall do so as follows:
11	(1) Right turns. Both the approach for a right turn and a
12	right turn shall be made as close as practicable to
13	the right-hand curb or edge of the roadway.
14	(2) Left turns. The driver of a vehicle intending to turn
15	left at any intersection shall approach the
16	intersection in the extreme left-hand lane lawfully
17	available to traffic moving in the direction of travel

1	of such vehicle, and, after entering the intersection,
2	the left turn shall be made so as to leave the
3	intersection in a lane lawfully available to traffic
4	moving in such direction upon the roadway being
5	entered. Whenever practicable the left turn shall be
6	made in that portion of the intersection to the left
7	of the center of the intersection.
8	(b) The driver of a bicycle proceeding in a right turn
9	only lane may continue proceeding through an intersection in the
10	direction of travel if the driver cannot with reasonable safety
11	merge left into the thru traffic lane prior to the intersection;
12	provided that the driver of the bicycle shall make a signal of
13	intention to turn left, which in this circumstance shall
14	indicate the intention to merge left into the thru traffic lane
15	as soon as practicable and continue proceeding in the thru
16	traffic lane.
17	$[\frac{(3)}{(c)}]$ The director of transportation and the counties
18	in their respective jurisdictions may cause official traffic-
19	control devices to be placed within or adjacent to intersections
20	and thereby require and direct that a different course from that
21	specified in this section be traveled by vehicles turning at an

- 1 intersection, and when such devices are so placed no driver of a
- 2 vehicle shall turn a vehicle at an intersection other than as
- 3 directed and required by such devices."
- 4 SECTION 3. Section 291C-84, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 5 amended to read as follows:
- 6 "§291C-84 Turning and bicycle proceeding movements and
- 7 required signals. (a) No person shall turn a vehicle at an
- 8 intersection unless the vehicle is in proper position upon the
- 9 roadway as required in section 291C-81, or turn a vehicle to
- 10 enter a private road or driveway, or otherwise turn a vehicle
- 11 from a direct course or move right or left upon a roadway unless
- 12 and until such movement can be made with reasonable safety. No
- 13 person shall so turn any vehicle without giving an appropriate
- 14 signal in the manner hereinafter provided.
- (b) [A] Except as provided in subsection (c), a signal of
- 16 intention to turn right or left when required shall be given
- 17 continuously during not less than the last one hundred feet
- 18 traveled by the vehicle before turning; provided that for a
- 19 bicycle or moped, such signal shall be given continuously during
- 20 not less than the last one hundred feet traveled by the bicycle
- 21 or moped before turning, and shall be given when the bicycle or

- 1 moped is stopped waiting to turn; and further provided that a
- 2 signal by hand and arm need not be given continuously by the
- 3 driver of a bicycle or moped if the hand is needed in the
- 4 braking, control, or operation of the bicycle or moped.
- 5 (c) The driver of a bicycle proceeding in a right turn
- 6 only lane may continue proceeding through an intersection in the
- 7 direction of travel if the driver cannot with reasonable safety
- 8 merge left into the thru traffic lane prior to the intersection;
- 9 provided that the driver of bicycle shall make a signal of
- 10 intention to turn left, which in this circumstance shall
- 11 indicate the intention to merge left into the thru traffic lane
- 12 as soon as practicable and continue proceeding in the thru
- 13 traffic lane.
- 14 $\left[\frac{(e)}{(e)}\right]$ (d) No person shall stop or suddenly decrease the
- 15 speed of a vehicle without first giving an appropriate signal in
- 16 the manner provided herein to the driver of any vehicle
- 17 immediately to the rear when there is opportunity to give such
- 18 signal.
- 19 [(d)] (e) The signals provided for in section 291C-85(b)
- 20 shall be used to indicate an intention to turn, change lanes, or
- 21 start from a parked position and shall not be flashed on one

- 1 side only on a parked or disabled vehicle, or flashed as a
- 2 courtesy or "do pass" signal to operators of other vehicles
- 3 approaching from the rear."
- 4 SECTION 4. Section 291C-145, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 5 amended to read as follows:
- 6 "§291C-145 Riding on roadways and bikeways. (a) Every
- 7 person operating a bicycle upon a roadway at a speed less than
- 8 the normal speed of traffic moving in the same direction at such
- 9 time shall ride as near to the right-hand curb, on the edge of
- 10 the roadway, or on the shoulder off of the roadway as
- 11 practicable, exercising due care when passing a standing vehicle
- 12 or one proceeding in the same direction; except under any of the
- 13 following situations:
- 14 (1) When preparing for a left turn at an intersection or
- into a private road or driveway, except where
- prohibited by official traffic-control devices;
- 17 (2) When reasonably necessary to avoid conditions
- 18 (including but not limited to fixed or moving objects,
- vehicles, bicycles, pedestrians, animals, surface
- 20 hazards, or substandard width lanes) that make it
- 21 unsafe to continue along the right-hand curb, on the

1		edge of the roadway, or on the shoulder off of the
2		roadway. For purposes of this section, a "substandard
3		width lane" is a lane that is too narrow for a bicycle
4		and a vehicle to travel safely side-by-side within the
5		lane; or
6	(3)	When a roadway is designated and signposted to carry
7		traffic in one direction only and has two or more
8		marked traffic lanes, a person operating a bicycle may
9		ride as near to the left-hand curb, on the edge of the
10		roadway, or on the shoulder off of such roadway as
11		practicable.
12	<u>(b)</u>	When approaching an intersection where right turns are
13	permitted	and there is a right turn only lane, a driver of a
14	bicycle m	ay proceed in the right turn only lane even if the
15	driver of	the bicycle does not intend to turn right; provided
16	that the	driver of the bicycle shall not pass a vehicle that is
17	stopped i	n the right turn only lane; provided further that the
18	driver of	the bicycle shall exercise reasonable safety when
19	passing a	vehicle proceeding in the same direction in the right

turn only lane.

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1	[-(b) -]	(c) Persons riding bicycles upon a roadway shall	
2	ride in si	ngle file; provided that where the flow of traffic is	
3	unimpeded,	riding two abreast upon bicycle lanes and bicycle	
4	paths shall	l be permitted when such lane or path is of sufficient	
5	width to a	llow riding two abreast unless otherwise prohibited by	
6	rule or ordinance adopted by the director of transportation or		
7	by the counties.		
8	[(c)]	(d) Whenever a usable bicycle lane has been provided	
9	on a highwa	ay, any person operating a bicycle at a speed less	
10	than the n	ormal speed of traffic moving in the same direction at	
11	such time	shall ride within such bicycle lane, except that such	
12	person may	move out of the lane under any of the following	
13	situations:		
14	(1)	When overtaking and passing another bicycle, vehicle,	
15	•	or pedestrian within the lane or about to enter the	
16		lane if such overtaking and passing cannot be done	
17		safely within the lane;	
18	(2)	When preparing for a left turn at an intersection or	
19		into a private road or driveway; or	
20	(3)	When reasonably necessary to leave the bicycle lane to	
21		avoid debris or other hazardous conditions.	

1 [(d)] (e) No person operating a bicycle shall leave a 2 bicycle lane until the movement can be made with reasonable 3 safety and then only after giving an appropriate signal in the event that any vehicle may be affected by the movement. 4 5 [+(e)-] (f) No person shall operate or ride a bicycle within 6 a bicycle lane in any direction except that permitted of 7 vehicular traffic traveling on the same side of the highway. Upon all bicycle paths of sufficient width and providing for 8 9 two-way movement of bicycle traffic, bicycles proceeding in opposite directions shall pass each other to the right. 10 $\left[\frac{f}{f}\right]$ (g) The director of transportation by rule and the 11 counties by ordinance may with respect to bikeways under their 12 respective jurisdictions restrict or prohibit the use of such 13 14 bikeways by mopeds. [(q)] (h) No person shall ride a bicycle equipped with a 15 16 motor on any sidewalk. The counties may, by ordinance, post bicycle lanes and bicycle paths to prevent persons riding a 17 18 bicycle equipped with a motor from using them." 19 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed

and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

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1 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Report Title:

Bicycles; Traffic Safety; Right Turn Only Lanes

Description:

Permits a bicyclist to proceed through an intersection from a right turn only lane if they cannot safely merge into the thru traffic lane, provided they signal intention to merge left. Permits a bicyclist to proceed in a right turn only lane when approaching an intersection, even if they do not intend to turn right, provided that they do not pass a stopped vehicle and that they exercise reasonable safety when passing a moving vehicle.

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
