#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII STATE LESBIAN, GAY, BISEXUAL, TRANSGENDER, QUEER, PLUS COMMISSION.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by
2	adding a new chapter to title 20 to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	"CHAPTER
5	HAWAII STATE LESBIAN, GAY, BISEXUAL, TRANSGENDER, QUEER, PLUS
6	COMMISSION
7	§ -1 Findings and purpose. The legislature finds that
8	there is a need to establish a body to improve the State's
9	interface with members of the lesbian, gay, bisexual,
10	transgender, queer, plus community; identify the short- and
11	long-range needs of its members; and ensure that there is an
12	effective means of researching, planning, and advocating for the
13	equity of this population in all aspects of state government.
14	The legislature further finds that establishing a program to
15	enable a better understanding of the risks and challenges,
16	including suicide, bullying, and ostracization, that the

- 2 will support better prevention and intervention strategies to
- 3 help this population.
- 4 Accordingly, the purpose of this chapter is to provide for
- 5 a statewide program, on a permanent and continuing basis, on the
- 6 status of lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, plus
- 7 people in Hawaii.
- 9 "Commission" means the Hawaii state lesbian, gay, bisexual,
- 10 transgender, queer, plus commission.
- "County committee" means each committee on the status of
- 12 lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, plus affairs as
- 13 appointed by the mayor of each respective county in accordance
- 14 with this chapter.
- "Lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, plus" includes
- 16 any individual who identifies as a member of the lesbian, gay,
- 17 bisexual, transgender, or queer community, or any individual who
- 18 identifies as a member of a sexual or gender minority, including
- 19 intersex, asexual, or pansexual individuals.
- 20 § -3 Hawaii state lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender,
- 21 queer, plus commission; membership. (a) There is established

- 1 (c) The governor shall appoint members of the commission
- 2 on the basis of their interest and knowledge in, and their
- 3 ability to make contributions to, the solution of problems
- 4 relating to the status of the lesbian, gay, bisexual,
- 5 transgender, queer, plus community.
- 6 (d) A chairperson of the commission shall be elected
- 7 annually from the seven appointed members of the commission. A
- 8 quorum to do business or validate any act of the commission
- 9 shall consist of a majority of the seven appointed members of
- 10 the commission.
- 11 § -4 Compensation. The members of the commission shall
- 12 serve without compensation but shall be reimbursed for expenses,
- 13 including travel expenses, necessary for the performance of
- 14 their duties.
- 15 § -5 Executive director. The commission shall appoint
- 16 an executive director for the proper administration and
- 17 enforcement of this chapter. The executive director shall be
- 18 appointed without regard to chapter 76.
- 19 § -6 Powers and duties of the commission. The
- 20 commission shall:

1	(1)	Act as a central clearinghouse and coordinating body
2		for governmental and nongovernmental activities and
3		information relating to the status of the lesbian,
4		gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, plus community in
5		the State;
6	(2)	Create public awareness and understanding of the
7		responsibilities, needs, potentials, and contributions
8		of the lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer,
9		plus community and their roles in the changing
10		society;
11	(3)	Recommend legislative and administrative action on
12		equal treatment and opportunities for members of the
13		lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, plus
14		community;
15	(4)	Promote the diversity of cultural expressions of
16		persons of all sexual orientations, gender identities,
17		gender expressions, and sex characteristics and ensure
18		the recognition of culturally based sexual and gender
19		identities specific to Hawaii, such as mahu and
20		aikane;

1	(3)	Encourage a long-range program of education of members
2		of the lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer,
3		plus community in their political rights and
4		responsibilities, particularly with respect to their
5		voting duties;
6	(6)	Maintain contacts with appropriate federal, state,
7		local, and international agencies concerned with the
8		status of the lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender,
9		queer, plus community;
10	(7)	Cooperate and collaborate with national groups on the
11		status of the lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender,
12		queer, plus community and arrange for participation by
13		representatives of the State in White House
14		conferences and other national conferences;
15	(8)	Administer funds allocated for the commission's work,
16		including accepting, disbursing, and allocating funds
17		that may become available from other governmental and
18		private sources; provided that all funds shall be
19		disbursed or allocated in compliance with any specific
20		designation stated by the donor; provided further that

in the absence of any specific designation, the funds

1		shall be disbuised of allocated to projects related to
2		any of the purposes of this chapter; and
3	(9)	Submit to the governor and legislature an annual
4		report with recommendations.
5	§ -	-7 County committees on lesbian, gay, bisexual,
6	transgende	er, queer, plus affairs; membership; organization. (a)
7	The mayor	of each county may appoint a county committee on the
8	status of	lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, plus
9	affairs.	Each county committee may be charged with:
10	(1)	The duty and responsibility of developing information
11		as the commission requires or as the county committee
12		deems advisable concerning the status of the members
13		of the lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer,
14		plus community within the respective counties; and
15	(2)	Any other appropriate duties and responsibilities as
16		may be deemed necessary by the respective counties.
17	(b)	The county committees may submit to the commission
18	plans and	proposals affecting the status of members of the
19	lesbian,	gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, plus community in
20	the respec	ctive counties.

1 (c) Each county committee may endeavor to secure the 2 widest possible citizen participation in its efforts and, for 3 this purpose, use existing public or private organizations. Each county committee may include the county attorney or 5 corporation counsel and the county representative of the 6 commission as ex officio members. The other members may be 7 selected on the basis of their interest and knowledge in, and 8 their ability to make contributions to, the solution of problems 9 relating to the lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, plus 10 community within the respective county and their knowledge of 11 local conditions. The chairperson of each county committee may 12 be elected annually from the nongovernmental members of the 13 county committee. The terms of office of each member may be 14 four years. Each county committee may meet at least four times a year. The members of the county committees shall not receive 15 16 compensation for their services. The county legislative bodies 17 shall be authorized to make appropriations to meet the necessary 18 expenses of their respective committees." 19 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general 20 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so 21 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 for

- 1 the Hawaii state lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer,
- 2 plus commission and to carry out the purposes of this Act.
- 3 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 4 human services for the purposes of this Act.
- 5 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;

6 provided that section 2 shall take effect on July 7, 2022.
