A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO DISASTER RESPONSE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Hawaii has always been vulnerable to natural
- 2 disasters, including hurricanes, earthquakes, volcanic
- 3 eruptions, storm surges, tsunamis, and wildfires. The
- 4 legislature finds that over the years, various state departments
- 5 and agencies have been affected by natural disasters and
- 6 emergencies and have spent departmental funds to respond to
- 7 incidents as necessary. Many departments apply for
- 8 reimbursement for the costs of emergency response measures from
- 9 the Federal Emergency Management Agency. Disaster reimbursement
- 10 may take months or years, depending on the federal government.
- 11 The delay in disaster reimbursements has resulted in the holding
- 12 of federal reimbursement funds in the major disaster fund,
- 13 rather than the funds being returned to the originating
- 14 department or agency.
- The purpose of this Act is to:
- 16 (1) Clarify that federal funds received by the State for
- 17 reimbursement of disaster-related expenses, except for

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1		federal funds received by the State to reimburse the
2		department of education for disaster-related expenses,
3		shall first be applied to the originating fund used by
4		the department or agency for payment of disaster
5		relief expenses; provided that if the original
6		appropriation has lapsed, the funds shall be returned
7		to the general fund;
8	(2)	Require the administrator of the Hawaii emergency
9		management agency to submit an annual report to the
10		legislature on the status of federal reimbursement
11		moneys for disaster response, and disaster response
12		spending by each state agency; and
13	(3)	Appropriate funds to the department of defense for
14		disaster response efforts.
15	SECT	ION 2. Section 127A-16, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
16	amended t	o read as follows:
17	"§12	7A-16 Major disaster fund. (a) The administrator
18	shall sub	mit requests to the legislature to appropriate from the
19	general r	evenues of the State sufficient moneys as may be
20	necessary	for expenditure by or under the direction of the

1 governor for immediate relief in response to an emergency or 2 disaster in any part of the State; provided that: 3 (1)The governor has issued a proclamation of a state of 4 emergency; 5 (2) The governor [may] shall not expend in excess of 6 \$10,000,000 for immediate relief as a result of any 7 single emergency or disaster; and 8 (3) In addition to the funds in paragraph (2), an 9 additional \$5,000,000 may be made available solely for 10 the purpose of matching federal disaster relief funds 11 when these funds become available to the State 12 following a presidential disaster declaration. 13 In expending the moneys, the governor may allot any portion 14 thereof to any agency, office, or employee of the State or a 15 county for the most efficient relief for the population. 16 Notwithstanding this subsection, the only exception to 17 paragraphs (1), (2), and (3) is that the administrator may use up to \$250,000 per year to support the emergency management 18 19 reserve corps. 20 (b) No later than sixty days after any allotment by the

governor or the expenditure of any fund moneys, the

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- 1 administrator shall report to the legislature on the purpose of
- 2 the allotment or expenditure.
- 3 (c) Except as provided in subsection (d), federal
- 4 reimbursement moneys for disaster relief shall be deemed to be
- 5 trust moneys and [may] shall be deposited into a trust account
- 6 with and under the control of the Hawaii emergency management
- 7 agency. [These moneys and any interest earned thereon shall be
- 8 used for the purpose identified in subsection (a) and shall not
- 9 lapse to the general fund. Don receipt by the Hawaii
- 10 emergency management agency, these moneys shall be reimbursed to
- 11 the originating fund of the expending agency; provided that if
- 12 the original appropriation has lapsed, the funds shall be
- 13 returned to the general fund.
- 14 (d) In cases in which the department of education expends
- 15 the funds appropriated to the department for purposes deemed to
- 16 be reimbursable by federal reimbursement moneys for disaster
- 17 relief, the federal reimbursement moneys shall not lapse to the
- 18 general fund and shall be credited directly to the department of
- 19 education without regard to whether the original appropriation
- 20 has lapsed. Such funds shall carry over in accordance with
- 21 section 37-41.5(c).

1	[-(e)	Any unspent funding under \$2,500,000 shall be rolled
2	over to t	he next fiscal year to support future emergencies and
3	disasters	.]
4	(e)	Each state agency shall submit to the administrator no
5	later tha	n August 1 of each year a report of all funds expended,
6	if any, f	or the prior fiscal year by the state agency for
7	disaster	response. The report shall include:
8	(1)	The source of funds, including the name and account
9		number of the funding source;
10	(2)	The amount and purpose of each expenditure; and
11	(3)	Whether any programs, activities, or contracts were
12		reduced as a result of disaster response spending by
13		the state agency.
14	<u>(f)</u>	The administrator shall submit an annual report to the
15	legislatu	re no later than September 1 of each year on:
16	(1)	The amount of federal reimbursement moneys for
17		disaster response that the State or any county could
18		have applied for during the prior fiscal year. The
19		report shall indicate the amount of federal
20		reimbursement moneys for disaster response broken down
21		by department, agency, and county;

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1	(2)	The amount of federal reimbursement moneys for
2		disaster response that the State or any county applied
3		for and the amount received during the prior fiscal
4		year. The report shall indicate the amount of federal
5		reimbursement moneys for disaster response broken down
6		by department, agency, and county;
7	<u>(3)</u>	The justification for any difference in the amount of
8		federal reimbursement moneys for disaster response
9		that the State or county was eligible for and the
10		amount the State or county applied for;
11	(4)	The average amount of time between the submittal of ar
12		application for a Federal Emergency Management Agency
13		reimbursement and receipt of the funds;
14	(5)	The number of disaster accounts opened for the prior
15		fiscal year; and
16	(6)	The information relating to the expenditure of funds
17		that is reported by state agencies pursuant to
18		subsection (e)."
19	SECT	ION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
20	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so

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- 1 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 for
- 2 the department of defense for disaster response efforts.
- 3 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 4 defense for the purposes of this Act.
- 5 SECTION 4. If any part of this Act is found to be in
- 6 conflict with federal requirements that are a prescribed
- 7 condition for the allocation of federal funds to the State, the
- 8 conflicting part of this Act is inoperative solely to the extent
- 9 of the conflict and with respect to the agencies directly
- 10 affected, and this finding does not affect the operation of the
- 11 remainder of this Act in its application to the agencies
- 12 concerned. The rules under this Act shall meet federal
- 13 requirements that are a necessary condition to the receipt of
- 14 federal funds by the State.
- 15 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 16 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 17 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2051.

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Report Title:

Disaster Response; Disaster Relief; Major Disaster Fund; Federal Reimbursements; Reports; Appropriation

Description:

Requires federal disaster relief reimbursement moneys, except federal disaster relief reimbursement moneys for DOE, to be deposited into a trust account of the Hawaii emergency management agency and reimbursed to the originating fund of the expending agency, with funds to be returned to the general fund upon lapse of the original appropriation. Requires annual reports to the legislature on federal reimbursement moneys, and disaster response spending by each state agency. Appropriates funds. Effective 7/1/2051. (HD2)

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
