

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 321-483, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is				
2	amended by	y ame	nding subsection (b) to read as follows:		
3	"(b)	The	department shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter		
4	91 relating to:				
5	(1)	Stan	dards of conditions and competence for the		
6		oper	ation of community care foster family homes;		
7	(2)	Proc	edures for obtaining and renewing a certificate of

9	(3)	Mini	mum grievance procedures for clients of community		
10		care	foster family home services; and		
11	(4)	Requ	irements for primary and substitute caregivers		
12		caring for three clients in community care foster			
13		fami	ly homes <u>,</u> including:		
14		(A)	Mandating that primary and substitute caregivers		
15			be twenty-one years of age or older;		
16		(B)	Mandating that primary and substitute caregivers		
17			complete a minimum of twelve hours of continuing

1		education every twelve months or at least twenty-
2		four hours of continuing education every twenty-
3		four months;
4	(C)	Allowing the primary caregiver to be absent from
5		the community care foster family home for no more
6		than [twenty-eight] thirty-six hours in a
7		calendar week, not to exceed [five] eight hours
8		per day; provided that the substitute caregiver
9		is present in the community care foster family
10		home during the primary caregiver's absence;
11	(D)	Where the primary caregiver is absent from the
12		community care foster family home in excess of
13		the hours as prescribed in subparagraph (C),
14		mandating that the substitute caregiver be a
15		certified nurse aide; and
16	(E)	Mandating that the substitute caregiver have, at
17		a minimum, one year prior work experience as a
18		caregiver in a community residential setting or
19		in a medical facility."
20	SECTION 2	. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
21	and stricken.	New statutory material is underscored.

SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Report Title:

Community Care Foster Family Homes; Primary Caregivers

Description:

Requires the department of health to adopt rules to allow primary caregivers to be absent from community care foster family homes for no more than thirty-six, rather than twenty-eight, hours in a calendar week, not to exceed eight, rather than five, hours per day.
