

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO DRIVER'S LICENSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 286-106, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended to read as follows:
3	"\$286-106 Expiration of licenses. Every driver's license
4	issued under this part, except for a provisional license issued
5	under section 286-102.6 [which] that shall expire on the date of
6	the provisional licensee's nineteenth birthday, whether an
7	original issuance or a renewal, shall expire on the first
8	birthday of the licensee occurring not less than eight years
9	after the date of the issuance of the license, unless sooner
10	revoked or suspended; provided that:
11	(1) The license shall expire on the first birthday of the
12	licensee occurring not less than four years after the
13	date of the issuance if, at the time, the licensee is
14	[twenty-four]
15	(A) Twenty-four years of age or younger; or
16	(B) Seventy years of age or older but younger than
17	eighty years of age;

1	(2)	The license shall expire on the first birthday of the
2		licensee occurring not less than two years after the
3		date of the issuance of the license if, at that time,
4		the licensee is [seventy-two] eighty years of age or
5		older; and
6	(3)	If the licensee is a legal immigrant, the license
7		shall expire no later than the licensee's authorized
8		period of stay in the United States.
9	The	examiner of drivers may issue a license for a shorter
10	period if	the licensee has a physical condition or conditions
11	that the	examiner of drivers reasonably believes may impair the
12	driver's	ability to drive."
13	SECT	ION 2. Section 286-107, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
14	amended b	y amending subsections (b) and (c) to read as follows:
15	"(b)	Except as otherwise provided in subsection (c), an
16	applicant	for a renewal of a driver's license under this
17	section,	or the reactivation of an expired license under section
18	286-107.5	(a), shall appear in person before the examiner of
19	drivers a	nd the examiner of drivers shall administer such
20	physical	examinations as the state director of transportation
21	deems nec	essary to determine the applicant's fitness to continue

1 to operate a motor vehicle [-]; provided that an applicant who is 2 seventy years of age or older shall also present certification 3 of physical and mental competence from a doctor. 4 (c) Any person younger than seventy years of age who holds 5 a category (1), (2), or (3) license issued under this part who 6 is unable to appear in person before the examiner of drivers to 7 apply for a renewal of the driver's license[7] may, if the 8 person is not disqualified from renewing the license under 9 subsection (a) except as provided under subsection (h), apply 10 for a renewal by mail. The applicant's request to have the 11 license renewed by mail must be received by the examiner of 12 drivers within ninety days after the expiration of the license 13 or it shall be treated as an application for reactivation of an expired license under section 286-107.5. The examiner of 14 drivers [shall], upon receipt of the request, shall furnish the 15 16 applicant with all necessary forms and instructions. 17 application for renewal made pursuant to this subsection shall 18 be accompanied by a statement from a licensed physician, 19 physician assistant, or advanced practice registered nurse 20 certifying that the applicant was examined by the licensed 21 physician, physician assistant, or advanced practice registered

1	nurse not more than six months prior to the expiration date of
2	the applicant's license and that the applicant was found by the
3	examination to have met the physical requirements established by
4	the state director of transportation for the renewal of
5	licenses. The application for renewal shall also be accompanied
6	by:
7	(1) A notarized statement of the applicant certifying that
8	the applicant does not possess any valid license to
9	operate the same or similar category or categories of
10	motor vehicles, issued by another licensing authority
11	(unless the license is concurrently surrendered); and
12	(2) [Such] Any other information as may be required by the
13	examiner of drivers that is reasonably necessary to
14	confirm the identity of the applicant and the
15	applicant's fitness to continue to operate a motor
16	vehicle."
17	SECTION 3. Section 286-108, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
18	amended to read as follows:
19	"\$286-108 Examination of applicants. (a) Except as

provided in section 286-107.5(a), the examiner of drivers shall

examine every applicant for a driver's license, except as

1	otherwise	provided in this part. The examination shall include
2	a test of	:
3	(1)	The applicant's eyesight and any further physical
4		examination that the examiner of drivers finds
5		necessary to determine the applicant's fitness to
6		operate a motor vehicle safely upon the highways;
7	(2)	The applicant's ability to understand highway signs
8		regulating, warning, and directing traffic;
9	(3)	The applicant's knowledge of the rules of the road
10		based on the traffic laws of the State and the traffic
11		ordinances of the county where the applicant resides
12		or intends to operate a motor vehicle; provided that
13		the examination shall specifically test the
14		applicant's knowledge of the provisions of section
15		291C-121.5 and section 291C-137; and
16	(4)	The actual demonstration of ability to exercise
17		ordinary and reasonable control in the operation of a
18		motor vehicle.
19	The examin	nations shall be appropriate to the operation of the
20	category (of motor vehicle for which the applicant seeks to be

licensed and shall be conducted as required by the director.

The examiner of drivers shall require every applicant to 2 comply with section 286-102.5. 3 The examiner of drivers may waive the actual demonstration 4 of ability to operate a motorcycle or motor scooter for any 5 person who furnishes evidence, to the satisfaction of the 6 examiner of drivers, that the person has completed the 7 motorcycle education course approved by the director in accordance with section 431:10G-104. 8 9 For the purposes of this section, the term "applicant" does 10 not include any person reactivating a license under section 11 286-107.5(a). 12 (b) The examiner of drivers shall require proof from every 13 applicant under the age of eighteen that the applicant has 14 completed a driver education program and a behind-the-wheel 15 driver training course certified by the director of 16 transportation. The examiner of drivers shall not examine any 17 applicant for a provisional license who is sixteen through 18 seventeen years of age unless the applicant holds and has held a 19 valid instruction permit under section 286-110, for a period of 20 no fewer than one hundred eighty days. If the applicant's 21 instruction permit has expired and a new instruction permit was

- 1 issued within thirty days of its expiration, the examiner of
- 2 drivers may examine the applicant without requiring an
- 3 additional one hundred eighty day period.
- 4 (c) The examiner of drivers may waive the written or oral
- 5 examination required under subsection (a) (2) and (3) and the
- 6 actual demonstration of ability to operate a motor vehicle for
- 7 any person who:
- 8 (1) Is at least eighteen years of age and who possesses a
- 9 valid driver's license issued to the applicant in any
- other state of the United States, the District of
- 11 Columbia, the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, American
- 12 Samoa, Guam, a province of the Dominion of Canada, or
- the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands for
- 14 the operation of vehicles in categories 1 through 3 of
- 15 section 286-102;
- 16 (2) Has completed the same requirements as set forth in
- section 286-102.6(f) in another state and possesses a
- 18 valid provisional license from that state; or
- 19 (3) Is at least eighteen years of age and who possesses a
- valid driver's license issued to the applicant in any
- jurisdiction for which the director has granted

1	reciprocal licensing privileges in accordance with	
2	section 286-101.5 for the operation of vehicles in	
3	category (3) of section 286-102(b).	
4	(d) As part of the examination required by this section,	
5	the applicant for a driver's license shall produce and display a	
6	valid motor vehicle or liability insurance identification card	
7	for the motor vehicle required by sections 431:10C-107 and	
8	431:10G-106, when the applicant demonstrates the ability to	
9	operate a motor vehicle to the satisfaction of the examiner of	
10	drivers. If no valid motor vehicle or liability insurance	
11	identification card is displayed, the examiner of drivers shall	
12	not issue a driver's license to the applicant.	
13	(e) The examiner of drivers shall require every applicant	
14	who is seventy years of age or older to present certification of	
15	physical and mental competence from a doctor."	
16	SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed	
17	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.	
18	SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Report Title:

Driver's Licenses; Expiration and Renewal; Kupuna; Certification of Physical and Mental Competence

Description:

Extends the renewal period from 2 years to 4 years for licensees who are 70 years of age or older but younger than 80 years of age. Requires applicants for a new license or for license renewal who are 70 years of age or older to present certification of physical and mental competence from a doctor upon application.
