A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SINGLE-USE PLASTICS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that single-use plastic
- bottles are a threat to the State's oceans and vulnerable marine 2
- ecosystems. Each year, more than 15,000,000 metric tons of 3
- plastic enter the world's oceans. Experts predict that by 2050, 4
- 5 the amount of plastic in the ocean will outweigh fish, unless
- significant changes are made. The need for significant change 6
- in Hawaii was underscored in 2020, when the United States 7
- Environmental Protection Agency found that several of the
- State's beaches are "impaired by trash", with the majority of 9
- 10 the pollutants comprising single-use plastics.
- 11 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to take a phased
- 12 approach to prohibiting the manufacture, distribution, and sale
- 13 in the State of single-use plastic bottles and containers.
- SECTION 2. Section 342H-42, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 14
- 15 amended to read as follows:
- 16 "[**[]§342H-42[]] Prohibition**. (a) On or after January 1,
- 1992, no person shall manufacture, distribute, sell, or expose 17

1 for sale in this State any plastic bottle or rigid plastic container unless the product has a label indicating the plastic 2 resin used to produce the plastic bottle or rigid plastic 3 4 container. The label shall consist of a number placed within a 5 triangle of arrows and letters placed below the triangle. triangle shall be equilateral, formed by three arrows curved at 6 their midpoints and depicting a clockwise path around the code 7 8 number.
