## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LEGAL SERVICES FOR LOW-INCOME IMMIGRANTS.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 The legislature finds that there are many 2 immigrants and non-citizen residents from nations comprising the 3 Compact of Free Association in immigration related proceedings 4 who seek to continue legal residence or obtain legal status in 5 the country. However, the immigration court process is highly complex, which may be intimidating or overwhelming for 6 7 immigrants who may struggle with navigating a different culture 8 and language. Many immigrants may lack the resources to obtain 9 legal representation, which may have a profound impact on the immigrants' ability to receive a fair hearing. 10 11 To accurately effectuate the intent of this Act, as used 12 herein, the term "immigrant" shall include non-citizen residents 13 from nations comprising the Compact of Free Association. 14 The legislature further finds that Hawaii has always 15 embraced a welcoming attitude for people of all backgrounds, 16 nationalities, and ethnicities. According to the 2017 American

Immigration Council Fact Sheet, nearly eighteen per cent of

- 1 Hawaii residents are immigrants, while more than one in seven
- 2 residents is a native-born United States citizen with at least
- 3 one immigrant parent. Immigrants are an integral part of
- 4 Hawaii's diverse, multicultural community and make extensive
- 5 contributions to the State.
- 6 Given the current political climate and the number of
- 7 immigrants being detained and faced with deportation, immigrants
- 8 in Hawaii are in dire need of legal help. Therefore, there are
- 9 vital public policy reasons behind providing legal assistance
- 10 and legal counsel to immigrants in immigration proceedings.
- 11 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to appropriate
- 12 funds to the judiciary to contract with non-profit organizations
- 13 to provide legal counsel and assistance to low-income immigrants
- 14 in immigration related proceedings, including deportation
- 15 defense and asylum, and for any other immigration legal issues.
- 16 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 17 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$250,000 or so much
- 18 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 for the
- 19 judiciary to contract with non-profit organizations to provide
- 20 legal counsel and assistance to low-income immigrants in

- 1 immigrations related proceedings, including deportation defense
- 2 and asylum, and for any other immigration legal issues.
- 3 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the judiciary for
- 4 the purposes of this Act.
- 5 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2022.
