A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HOUSING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. This Act shall be known as the "Yes In My
- 2 Backyard Act".
- 3 SECTION 2. The legislature finds that the *Measuring*
- 4 Housing Demand in Hawaii, 2015-2025 report published by the
- 5 department of business, economic development, and tourism in
- 6 March 2015 finds that, based in part on the State's population
- 7 growth, the projected statewide demand for residential housing
- 8 was between 64,700 and 66,000 units. Although the department
- 9 finds that population growth in the State has slowed since the
- 10 2015 report, in the Hawaii Housing Demand: 2020-2030 report,
- 11 published in December 2019, the department still projects that
- 12 an additional 36,155 units will be needed between 2020 and 2030.
- The legislature further finds that "yes in my backyard"
- 14 legislation, which is aimed at increasing housing by reducing
- 15 administrative barriers and encouraging the adoption of more
- 16 flexible zoning and regulatory policies, has been enacted in
- 17 Oregon and California. Similar legislation aimed at increasing

- co-introduced on the federal level by United States Senator
- 3 Brian Schatz in May 2021.
- 4 The purpose of this Act is to encourage:

barriers to housing; and

- 5 (1) The counties to adopt zoning and regulatory policies
 6 that allow for greater housing opportunities for
 7 residents at all income levels by requiring each
 8 county to submit a biennial report to the legislature
 9 on its efforts to reduce or remove certain regulatory
 - (2) The Hawaii housing finance and development corporation and Hawaii public housing authority to allow for greater affordable housing opportunities by requiring the corporation and the authority to each submit a biennial report to the legislature and its respective board on its respective efforts to streamline affordable housing development based on its review of the county biennial reports submitted to the legislature required by this Act.

SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.

Counties; Hawaii Housing Finance and Development Corporation; Hawaii Public Housing Authority; Housing; Yes In My Backyard; Biennial Reports

Description:

Requires each county to submit biennial reports to the legislature on its efforts to reduce zoning and regulatory barriers to housing development. Requires the Hawaii housing finance and development corporation and Hawaii public housing authority to submit biennial reports, based on their individual review of the counties' reports, to the legislature and their respective board on streamlining affordable housing development. Effective 7/1/2050. (HD1)

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
