A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HOUSING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaii has the 2 highest rate of homelessness per capita of any state in the 3 nation. Hawaii also has the highest rate in the nation, per capita, of chronically unsheltered homeless. According to the 4 Hawaii Homelessness Initiative Point in Time Count for 2020, an 5 6 estimated 6,458 people live on the streets and in shelters in 7 Hawaii. Addressing homelessness requires a multi-faceted 8 approach that uses interventions targeted to the characteristics 9 of the population being served. The state rent supplement 10 program for homeless families and individuals is critically 11 necessary to address homelessness. The legislature further finds that the state rent
- The legislature further finds that the state rent
 supplement program provides a "shallow", but sustained subsidy
 to struggling households. Unlike the "deep" subsidy housing
 choice voucher program, better known as the section 8 program,
 which helps families at the lowest ends of the income scale by
 bridging a wide affordability gap between income and housing

- 1 costs, the state rent supplement program helps households who
- 2 are closer to financial self-sufficiency but still have a narrow
- 3 affordability gap to fill. The state rent supplement program
- 4 provides an ongoing subsidy, enabling homeless households or
- 5 those at imminent risk of homelessness to close the
- 6 affordability gap, maintain housing, and achieve self-
- 7 sufficiency.
- 8 Because individual subsidies under the state rent
- 9 supplement program are relatively low, the subsidies can resolve
- 10 homelessness for many individuals and families relative to the
- 11 total cost of the subsidy program.
- 12 The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds to support
- 13 the state rent supplement program.
- 14 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 15 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$1,500,000 or so much
- 16 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 for the
- 17 state rent supplement program established pursuant to section
- 18 356D-151, Hawaii Revised Statutes, and for one full time (1.0
- 19 FTE) public housing specialist II position.
- The sum appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii public
- 21 housing authority for the purposes of this Act.

1 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
