

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MOSQUITO CONTROL.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that non-native mosquitos 2 pose significant multi-sector threats to the State, including 3 negative impacts on human health, conservation, tourism, and 4 economics. Residents and visitors in the State face health 5 threats resulting from the transmission of mosquito-borne 6 diseases. Mosquito-borne diseases have also had a devastating 7 impact on Hawaii's native bird populations and continue to be 8 the leading driver in the ongoing extinction risk of most of 9 Hawaii's remaining endemic honeycreepers. 10 The legislature further finds that the department of land 11 and natural resources is involved in a multiagency mosquito 12 control project, along with various other state agencies, including the departments of agriculture and health. 13 14 The purpose of this Act is to bolster the efforts by the

- 5 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 to

- 8 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 9 land and natural resources for the purposes of this Act.
- 10 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2022.
