### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE NEIGHBOR ISLANDS BLIND AND VISUALLY IMPAIRED SERVICE PILOT PROGRAM.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to require the
- 2 department of human services to establish a neighbor islands
- 3 blind and visually impaired service pilot program that
- 4 supplements existing statewide services by providing training
- 5 and other services to neighbor island residents who are blind or
- 6 visually impaired.
- 7 SECTION 2. (a) The department of human services shall
- 8 establish a neighbor islands blind and visually impaired service
- 9 pilot program that provides training and other services to blind
- 10 and visually impaired individuals residing on the neighbor
- 11 islands.
- 12 (b) The pilot program shall provide peer-to-peer outreach,
- 13 sight loss adjustment, peer counseling support, and mobility
- 14 training to program participants, including:
- 15 (1) Outreach efforts to identify individual and program
- needs;

- 1 entity contracted by the department to organize and implement
- 2 the pilot program. All volunteers shall have the necessary
- 3 qualification, shall be chosen based on experience and training,
- 4 and shall utilize training methods consistent with the
- 5 structured discovery approach used by the new visions program
- 6 operated by the Ho'opono services for the blind branch within the
- 7 department of human services' division of vocational
- 8 rehabilitation.
- 9 (d) The pilot program shall also provide program
- 10 participants with special needs transportation assistance. The
- 11 department shall work with neighbor island transportation
- 12 service providers and other individuals and entities to develop
- 13 a special needs transportation assistance service network to
- 14 serve program participants.
- (e) Applications for participation in the pilot program
- 16 shall be submitted on a form furnished by the department. The
- 17 department shall establish procedures and requirements for
- 18 accepting program participants.
- 19 (f) The pilot program shall be authorized to extend and
- 20 supplement the existing services provided by the Ho'opono
- 21 services for the blind branch.

- 1 (1) A record of pilot program activities and
- 2 accomplishments;
- 3 (2) A recommendation on whether to extend the program; and
- 4 (3) Any proposed legislation.
- 5 (i) The department shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter
- 6 91, Hawaii Revised Statutes, and prescribe forms necessary to
- 7 carry out the purposes of this Act.
- 8 (j) As used in this section:
- 9 "Department" means the department of human services.
- 10 "Neighbor island" means a county with a population less
- 11 than five hundred thousand.
- "Pilot program" means the neighbor islands blind and
- 13 visually impaired service pilot program to be established
- 14 pursuant to this Act.
- 15 "Program participant" means a resident of a neighbor island
- 16 whose mobility or ability to live independently is substantially
- 17 limited due to loss of sight and who is participating in the
- 18 pilot program.
- 19 "Special needs transportation" means transportation
- 20 provided to program participants at times or for trips when
- 21 public transportation is not a reasonable option.

- 1 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general 2 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ 3 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 to 4 fund the establishment and operation of the neighbor islands 5 blind and visually impaired service pilot program, including: 6 Funding for the hiring of necessary staff, travel, and (1) 7 per diem expenses; 8 (2) Stipends for living expenses for pilot program 9 volunteers; 10 (3) Provision of special transportation assistance for 11 program participants; and 12 (4) Other necessary expenses associated with the pilot 13 program; 14 provided that any funds appropriated pursuant to this section 15 shall be in addition to and shall not supplant any portion of 16 the base budget for any state or county agency providing 17 services for blind or visually impaired persons.
- 20 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2060, and 21 shall be repealed on June 30, 2025.
