A BILL FOR AN ACT

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds it to be in the best
- 2 interest of the public to allow each member of the information
- 3 privacy and security council to appoint a designee to act on the
- 4 member's behalf to ensure quorum.
- 5 SECTION 2. Section 487N-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 6 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
- 7 "(a) There is established an information privacy and
- 8 security council within the department of accounting and general
- 9 services for administrative purposes only. Members of the
- 10 council shall be appointed no later than September 1, 2008, by
- 11 the governor without regard to section 26-34 and shall be
- 12 composed of the following representatives:
- 13 (1) Executive agencies that maintain extensive
- 14 personal information in the conduct of their duties,
- including the department of commerce and consumer
- 16 affairs, the department of education, the department of
- 17 health, the department of human resources development,

2		Hawaii, to be selected by the governor;
3	(2)	The legislature, to be selected by the president

8	(4)	The four counties, to be selected by the mayor of
9		each county; provided that the mayor of each county

PURPOSE:

To allow each member of the Information and Privacy Security Council (IPSC) to designate a person from that member's agency to attend a meeting and act on the member's behalf in the event the appointed member cannot attend a meeting, in order to ensure that a quorum

is present.

MEANS:

Amend section 487N-5, Hawaii Revised

Statutes (HRS).

JUSTIFICATION:

The IPSC is often unable to meet quorum. IPSC members, consisting solely of state and county employees, are often unable to attend IPSC meetings due to work related emergencies and other work priorities. As a result, key discussion and decision making on items such as the annual summary report to the Legislature required by section 487N-5, HRS, and the personal information system annual reports, required by section 487N-7, HRS, are delayed. Allowing IPSC members to designate a person to act on the member's behalf will alleviate these challenges.

Impact on the public: Would allow the public's privacy concerns to be discussed and acted upon for decision-making.

Impact on the department and other agencies:
The appointed member would select a designee from the agency for representation on the IPSC in the event the appointed member is unable to attend the meeting.
