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# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC EMPLOYMENT COST ITEMS.

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:**

1 PART I

2 SECTION 1. There are appropriated or authorized from the  
3 sources of funding indicated below to collective bargaining  
4 statewide (BUF 102) the following sums or so much thereof as may  
5 be necessary to fund for fiscal biennium 2021-2023 all  
6 collective bargaining cost items in the agreement negotiated  
7 with the exclusive representative of collective bargaining  
8 unit (9):

8 who are excluded from collective bargaining, assigned to the  
9 Hawaii health systems corporation, and belong to the same  
10 compensation plans as those officers and employees within  
11 bargaining unit (9):

14 SECTION 12. Funds authorized by this part shall be  
15 allotted by the director of finance to the Hawaii health systems  
16 corporation for expenditure in the respective fiscal year for

18 PART VII

19 SECTION 13. Salary increases and cost adjustments provided  
20 in this Act for any officer or employee whose compensation is  
21 paid, in whole or in part, from federal, special, or other funds



1 shall be paid wholly or proportionately, as the case may be,  
2 from the respective funds.

3 SECTION 14. The fiscal year 2021-2022 appropriations or  
4 authorizations under this Act shall not lapse until the end of  
5 fiscal biennium 2021-2023; provided that funds appropriated or  
6 authorized by this Act that are not expended or encumbered by  
7 June 30, 2023, shall lapse as of that date.

8 SECTION 15. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
