## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII EMPLOYER-UNION HEALTH BENEFITS TRUST FUND MEDICARE PART B PREMIUM REIMBURSEMENT.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the State and
- 2 counties reimburse retirees and their spouses medicare part B
- 3 premiums including income related monthly adjustment amounts
- 4 (IRMAA). An IRMAA is added to the monthly medicare part B
- 5 standard premium amount of \$148.50 for 2021 if the retiree's
- 6 annual federal tax return income two years prior was over a
- 7 certain threshold. For example, the following are the income
- 8 thresholds applied to the 2019 federal tax return income to
- 9 determine 2021 medicare part B premiums and the number of state
- 10 retirees and spouses in each group:

2	related monthly adjustment amounts for retired
3	employees hired after June 30, 2022, and their
4	spouses, for each of the following who are enrolled in
5	the medicare part B medical insurance plan: (A) an
6	employee-beneficiary who is a retired employee, (B) an
7	employee-beneficiary's spouse while the employee-
8	beneficiary is living, and (C) an employee-
9	beneficiary's spouse, after the death of the employee-
10	beneficiary, if the spouse qualifies as an employee-

18	insurance plan, excluding medicare income related
19	monthly adjustment amounts for retired employees hired

21	increase in the medicare part B medical insurance plan

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1		rate, the fund shall reimburse each employee-
2		beneficiary and employee-beneficiary's spouse for the
3		cost increase within thirty days of the rate change.
4		Each employee-beneficiary and employee-beneficiary's
5		spouse who becomes entitled to reimbursement from the
6		fund for medicare part B premiums after July 1, 2006,
7		shall designate a financial institution account into
8		which the fund shall be authorized to deposit
9		reimbursements. This method of payment may be waived
10		by the fund if another method is determined to be more
11		appropriate;
12	(3)	The benefits available under this plan, when combined
13		with benefits available under medicare or any other
14		coverage or plan to which this plan is subordinate
15		under the National Association of Insurance
16		Commissioners' coordination of benefit rules, shall
17		approximate the benefits that would be provided to a
18		similarly situated employee-beneficiary not eligible
19		for medicare;
20	(4)	All employee-beneficiaries or dependent-beneficiaries
21		who are eligible to enroll in the medicare part B
