A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CYBERSECURITY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 128B-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended to read as follows: 3 "§128B-1 [Cybersecurity, economic, education, and infrastructure security coordinator; powers and duties.] Hawaii 5 state cybersecurity program; authorities. (a) There is 6 established [the full-time] a Hawaii state cybersecurity[7 7 economic, education, and infrastructure security coordinator] 8 program. The purpose of the program is to oversee cybersecurity 9 and cyber resiliency matters [, including cybersecurity, 10 economic, education, and infrastructure security for the State. 11 The coordinator shall be placed within the state department of 12 defense]. 13 [(b) The coordinator shall be selected by the state 14 adjutant general based on the recommendations of the various 15 agencies, departments, and private entities that will partner

with the coordinator.

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1	(c) The [coordinator shall partner] program shall be
2	administered by the office of homeland security in partnership
3	with representatives from the following entities:
4	(1) The Hawaii state fusion center;
5	[(2) The Hawaii state cyber resiliency center;
6	(3) (2) Federal government agencies;
7	[(4)] <u>(3)</u> State government agencies;
8	$[\frac{(5)}{(4)}]$ The counties of the State;
9	$[\frac{(6)}{(5)}]$ Institutions of higher education; and
10	$[\frac{(7)}{(6)}]$ Other entities within the power, water,
11	communications, transportation, and finance sectors,
12	including public utilities, private telecommunications
13	companies, airlines, financial institutions, and
14	private information technology companies.
15	$[\frac{d}{d}]$ <u>(c)</u> Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, <u>in</u>
16	administering the program, the [coordinator,] office of homeland
17	security, through its various partnerships, shall develop the
18	requirements and methods for:
19	(1) Improving cyber resiliency within the State through
20	the development of a structure that shall include

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1		education, cybersecurity, and critical infrastructure
2		protection;
3	(2)	Improving the State's critical infrastructure network
4		and resiliency, including identifying
5		interdependencies of critical infrastructures, points
6		of connection between critical infrastructures, the
7		most critical nodes, and the cascading effects of a
8		cyber-attack on these points of connection between
9		critical infrastructure;
10	(3)	Improving the State's cybersecurity by using existing
11		resources within the State;
12	(4)	Examining specific requirements and actions to
13		accelerate the growth of the cybersecurity industry in
14		the State;
15	(5)	Defining the requirements and opportunities to secure
16		state, federal, and private moneys for cybersecurity
17		activities and related educational programs;
18	(6)	Forming partnerships to implement cyber resiliency
19		structures and protocol to identify and share
20		information about possible cyber-attacks and mitigate

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1		damage and recover quickly and efficiently from cyber-
2		attacks; and
3	(7)	Expanding the State's cybersecurity and cyber
4		resiliency understanding and workforce through
5		education.
6	[(e)	d) The [coordinator] office of homeland security
7	may [requ	est] utilize the assistance of other departments,
8	agencies,	and private companies[, both] inside and outside of
9	the State	to [carry out its duties.] administer the program.
10	[(f)	(e) For the purposes of this section:
11	["C	oordinator" shall mean the Hawaii cybersecurity,
12	economie,	education, and infrastructure security coordinator.]
13	"Су	ber resiliency" shall mean the ability to complete
14	vulnerabi	lity assessments, identify potential cyber-attacks,
15	mitigate	losses from cyber-attacks, and recover quickly and
16	efficient	ly from cyber-attacks.
17	"Pro	gram" means the Hawaii state cybersecurity program."
