PURPOSE:

To amend the Workforce Development Council (WDC) law to be consistent with the state

budget as enacted in the General

Appropriations Act of 2021, Act 88, Session

Laws of Hawaii 2021; to conform the WDC

statute to the conflict of interest

provisions and nomenclature found in the

corresponding federal law.

**MEANS:** 

Amend the title of chapter 202, add one new section to chapter 202, amend sections 202-1 and 202-3, and repeal section 202-5, Hawaii

Revised Statutes.

JUSTIFICATION:

The General Appropriations Act of 2021, eliminated the program identification number (LBR135) of the WDC and transferred its appropriation and positions to the Workforce Development Division.

Title 29 United States Code section 3111(f) addresses conflicts of interest for board members of the WDC. Title 29 United States Code section 3122(h) addresses conflicts of interest for board members of the local workforce development boards and for standing committee members of local workforce development boards. This bill codifies those federal provisions in the state law.

The bill also makes the terminology used in the state statute consistent with the federal law by changing the name of the state and local entities, i.e., Hawaii Workforce Development Board and local workforce development boards.
