# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO A DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that, unlike most states,
- 2 Hawaii has no executive-level department dedicated to the
- 3 mission of environmental protection and implementing the
- 4 environmental policy goals enacted by the legislature. Instead,
- 5 these functions are dispersed among multiple departments having
- 6 differing missions that either do not focus on the importance of
- 7 environmental protection or have internal conflicts.
- 8 The legislature further finds that because the ongoing
- 9 climate crisis is one of the overarching issues of modern times,
- 10 the protection of the State's environment and natural resources
- 11 is more critical than ever. Although almost all issues are
- 12 multi-jurisdictional, the legislature believes that creating an
- 13 executive-level department to unite this important work under
- 14 one administrative umbrella will lead to greater efficiency in
- 15 addressing Hawaii's environmental issues in a timely and
- 16 proactive fashion.
