### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE BOARD OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the board of land 2 and natural resources does not currently require any member to have a background in, or experience with, the State's fishing 3 4 and boating communities. The legislature recognizes the value 5 of ensuring that at least one board member has knowledge of the issues faced by these communities, including issues relating to 6 7 ocean conservation and traditional fishing rights. A board member who has experience with these issues can educate other 8 9 board members and help ensure the board makes well-informed 10 decisions on matters affecting the fishing and boating 11 communities. 12 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to require at least 13 one member of the board of land and natural resources to be 14 recommended by a statewide fishing organization and to have 15 demonstrated knowledge of, and experience with, the State's 16 boating and fishing communities, including knowledge of ocean **17** conservation and traditional fishing rights.

1 SECTION 2. Section 171-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended to read as follows: 3 "§171-4 Board of land and natural resources; terms and 4 qualifications of members of the board; organization; expenses. 5 The board of land and natural resources shall be composed 6 of seven members, one from each land district and three at 7 large, to be nominated and, by and with the advice and consent 8 of the senate, appointed by the governor as provided in section 9 26-34[-], except as provided in subsection (d). The term and 10 removal of a member of the board and the filling of a vacancy on 11 the board shall also be as provided in section 26-34[-] and 12 subsection (d). There shall be not more than three members on 13 the board from the same political party. 14 (b) At least one member of the board, other than the 15 members appointed pursuant to subsections (c) and (d), shall 16 have a background in conservation and natural resources, as 17 evidenced by: 18 (1) A college degree in a relevant field, including 19 forestry, wildlife conservation, geology, 20 environmental science, or marine biology; or

20	or joint venture in which the member is an officer, partner, or		
21	employee. Any member having any interest, direct or indirect,

- 2 voting on or participating in the discussion of the matter.
- 3 [<del>(e)</del>] <u>(f)</u> The governor shall select a chairperson of the
- 4 board from among its members. The chairperson shall call and
- 5 preside at meetings and may appoint a member of the board as
- 6 secretary. The members of the board shall choose one of their
- 7 number to act as chairperson during the absence or disability of
- 8 the chairperson.
- 9 [<del>(f)</del>] <u>(g)</u> The members of the board shall serve without pay
- 10 but shall be entitled to reimbursement for necessary expenses
- 11 while attending meetings and while in the discharge of their
- 12 duties."
- 13 SECTION 3. This Act shall apply to any vacancy of a member
- 14 appointed pursuant to section 171-4(6), Hawaii Revised Statutes,
- 15 that occurs on the board of land and natural resources after the
- 16 effective date of this Act.
- 17 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 18 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

1 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
