## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE PHOTO RED LIGHT IMAGING DETECTOR SYSTEMS PROGRAM.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	PART I
2	SECTION 1. Section 291C-32, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
3	amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows:
4	"(c) Whenever traffic is controlled by traffic-control
5	signals exhibiting different colored lights, or colored lighted
6	arrows, successively one at a time or in combination, [are] and
7	actively monitored by an official photo red light imaging
8	detector system, all registered owners of all motor vehicles in
9	vehicular traffic at the intersection shall be held strictly
10	liable for the motor vehicle's compliance with the traffic-
11	control signal, to the extent that registered owners may be
12	cited and held accountable for non-compliance via civil traffic
13	infractions pursuant to chapter 291J. The traffic-control
14	signal lights shall apply to $\underline{\text{the}}$ registered owners $[\underline{\text{and}}]$ $\underline{\text{of}}$
15	motor vehicles as follows:
16	(1) Steady red indication:

1	(A)	Vehicular traffic facing a steady red signal
2		alone shall stop at a clearly marked stop line,
3		but if none, before entering the crosswalk on the
4		near side of the intersection or, if none, then
5		before entering the intersection and shall remain
6		standing until an indication to proceed is shown,
7		except as provided in the next succeeding
8		paragraphs.
9	(B)	Vehicular traffic that is stopped in obedience to
10		a steady red indication may make a right turn but
11		shall yield the right-of-way to pedestrians and
12		other traffic proceeding as directed by the
13		signal at said intersection, except that counties
14		by ordinance may prohibit any such right turn
15		against a steady red indication, which ordinance
16		shall be effective when a sign is erected at such
17		intersection giving notice thereof.
18	(C)	Vehicular traffic on a one-way street that
19		intersects another one-way street on which
20		traffic moves to the left shall stop in obedience
21		to a steady red indication but may then make a

1	Tert curn into said one-way screet, but sharr
2	yield right-of-way to pedestrians, proceeding as
3	directed by the signal at said intersection
4	except that counties by ordinance may prohibit
5	any such left turn as above described which
6	ordinance shall be effective when a sign is
7	erected at such intersection giving notice
8	thereof.
9	(2) To the extent a registered owner's motor vehicle fails
10	to comply with any other law or ordinance related to
11	traffic-control signals, including subsection (a)(1)
12	or (2), the registered owner of a motor vehicle shall
13	not be held strictly liable unless otherwise provided
14	by law."
15	SECTION 2. Section 291J-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
16	amended by amending the definition of "photo red light imaging
17	detector" to read as follows:
18	""Photo red light imaging detector" or "photo red light
19	imaging detector system" means a device, or combination of
20	devices, used for traffic enforcement pursuant to section 291C-
21	32(c), that includes a vehicle sensor [that works] working in

- 1 conjunction and synchronization with a traffic-control signal
- 2 and a camera [synchronized] to automatically record one or more
- 3 sequenced photographs, microphotographs, or electronic images of
- 4 the rear of the motor vehicle and motor vehicle license plate at
- 5 the time the motor vehicle fails to stop when facing a steady
- 6 red traffic-control signal [in violation of section
- $7 \frac{291C-32(c)}{2}$ ."
- 8 SECTION 3. Section 291J-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 9 amended by amending subsection (e) to read as follows:
- 10 "(e) During the first thirty days of operation of an
- 11 individual photo red light imaging detector system at a
- 12 particular traffic signal, a warning shall be issued for any
- 13 violation of section 291C-32(c), and mailed to the registered
- 14 owner of the motor vehicle at the address on record [as] at the
- 15 vehicle licensing division, in lieu of a summons or citation
- 16 pursuant to section 291J-6."
- 17 SECTION 4. Section 291J-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 18 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
- "(a) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, and except
- 20 for the time period allowed pursuant to [+] section[+] 291J-4(e),
- 21 beginning January 1, 2021, whenever any motor vehicle is

- 1 determined, by means of a photo red light imaging detector
- 2 system, to have disregarded a steady red signal in violation of
- 3 section 291C-32(c), the State's or county's third party
- 4 contractor shall cause a summons or citation, as described in
- 5 this section, to be sent by first class mail[ that is
- 6 postmarked within ten calendar days after the date of the
- 7 incident, to the registered owner of the motor vehicle [at the
- 8 address on record at the vehicle licensing division]. The
- 9 summons or citation shall be mailed to the registered owner's
- 10 address on record at the vehicle licensing division and
- 11 postmarked within ten calendar days after the date of the
- 12 incident. If the end of the ten calendar day period falls on a
- 13 Saturday, Sunday, or holiday, then the ending period shall run
- 14 until the end of the next day that is not a Saturday, Sunday, or
- 15 holiday."
- 16 SECTION 5. Section 291J-7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 17 amended to read as follows:
- "[+] \$291J-7[+] Registered owner's responsibility for a
- 19 summons or citation. (a) In any proceeding for a violation of
- 20 this chapter, the information contained in the summons or
- 21 citation, mailed in accordance with section 291J-6, shall be

1	deemed prima facte evidence that a violation of section
2	291C-32(c) occurred. [If the registered owner does not rebut
3	the evidence presented in this subsection by presenting one or
4	more of the defenses listed in subsection (b), the] The
5	registered owner shall be strictly liable for a violation of
6	section 291C-32(c)[ $\div$ ], unless the registered owner presents one
7	or more of the defenses listed in subsection (b) by a
8	preponderance of the evidence.
9	(b) The registered owner of the motor vehicle may present
10	[evidence] the following to rebut the evidence in subsection (a)
11	[by any one of the following]:
12	[(1) Submitting a written statement as provided in section
13	<del>291D-6(b)(2);</del>
14	(2) (1) [Testifying in open court under oath] Evidence
15	that the person named in the summons or citation was
16	not the registered owner of the motor vehicle at the
17	time of the alleged violation;
18	[(3) Calling witnesses to testify in open court under oath
19	that the person named in the summons or citation was
20	not the registered owner of the motor vehicle at the
21	time of the alleged violation;

1	<del>(4)</del> ]	(2) [Submitting evidence] Evidence that the motor
2		vehicle passed through the intersection [when the
3		traffic light was red in order] to yield the right-of-
4		way to an emergency vehicle;
5	[ <del>(5)</del> ]	(3) [Submitting evidence] Evidence that the motor
6		vehicle [was] passed through the intersection as part
7		of a funeral procession escorted by the police;
8	[ <del>(6)</del> ]	(4) [Presenting, prior to the return date established
9		on the citation or summons issued pursuant to this
10		chapter, a letter of verification of loss from the
<b>1</b> 1		police department indicating] Evidence that the motor
12		vehicle or the motor vehicle license plates [had been]
13		were reported to the police department as stolen, [to
14		the court adjudicating] prior to the alleged
15		violation; or
16	[ <del>(7)</del> ]	(5) [Submitting evidence] Evidence that the motor
17		vehicle passed through the intersection at the
18		direction of a law enforcement officer."
19	SECT	ION 6. Section 291J-12, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
20	amended by	y amending subsection (b) to read as follows:

- ${f 1}$  "(b) All fines collected under this chapter shall be
- 2 deposited into the photo red light imaging detector systems
- 3 program special fund. Moneys in the fund shall be expended by
- 4 the department in the county in which the fine was imposed, for
- 5 purposes that include the establishment, [implementation,]
- 6 operation, oversight, repair, and maintenance of a photo red
- 7 light imaging detector system [-] and implementation of the photo
- 8 red light imaging detector system program."
- 9 PART II
- 10 SECTION 7. Act 30, Session Laws of Hawaii 2020, sections 9
- 11 and 10, as amended by section 1 of Act 133, Session Laws of
- 12 Hawaii 2021, are amended to read as follows:
- "SECTION 9. There is appropriated out of the state highway
- 14 fund the sum of \$2,000,000 or so much thereof as may be
- 15 necessary for fiscal year 2020-2021; \$400,000 or so much as may
- 16 be necessary for fiscal year 2021-2022; and \$400,000 or so much
- 17 as may be necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 to be deposited
- 18 into the photo red light imaging detector systems program
- 19 special fund.
- 20 SECTION 10. There is appropriated out of the photo red
- 21 light imaging detector systems program special fund the sum of

- 1 \$2,000,000 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
- 2 year 2020-2021; \$400,000 or so much as may be necessary for
- 3 fiscal year 2021-2022; and \$400,000 or so much as may be
- 4 necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 for purposes of establishing
- 5 the photo red light imaging detector systems pilot program;
- 6 provided that the moneys appropriated for fiscal year 2020-2021,
- 7 fiscal year 2021-2022, and fiscal year 2022-2023 shall not lapse
- 8 at the end of that fiscal year; provided further that all moneys
- 9 appropriated for fiscal year 2020-2021, fiscal year 2021-2022,
- 10 and fiscal year 2022-2023 that are unexpended or unencumbered as
- 11 of June 30,  $\left[\frac{2022}{r}\right]$  2025, shall lapse to the credit of the photo
- 12 red light imaging detector systems special fund.
- 13 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 14 transportation for the purposes of this Act; provided that the
- 15 department of transportation shall [expend \$112,602] transfer
- 16 \$125,779 in [fiscal year 2021-2022,] fiscal year 2022-2023,
- 17 [and] fiscal year 2023-2024 [for the funding of one permanent
- 18 full-time (1.0 FTE) deputy prosecuting attorney position
- 19 within], and fiscal year 2024-2025 to the department of the
- 20 prosecuting attorney of the city and county of Honolulu. The
- 21 department of the prosecuting attorney shall expend these funds

- 1 exclusively for personnel costs related to the photo red light
- 2 imaging detector systems program; provided that any remaining
- 3 balances in any of the fiscal years shall be returned to the
- 4 department of transportation."
- 5 PART III
- 6 SECTION 8. If any provision of this Act, or the
- 7 application thereof to any person or circumstance, is held
- 8 invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or
- 9 applications of the Act that can be given effect without the
- 10 invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions
- 11 of this Act are severable.
- 12 SECTION 9. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 13 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 14 SECTION 10. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050;
- 15 provided that part II shall take effect retroactive to June 30,
- **16** 2021.
