A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that permitting post
- 2 office box addresses to be used as an option for prescriptions,
- 3 as long as the physical location where an individual resides is
- 4 on file, would provide more efficiency for pharmacists in having
- 5 prescriptions reach consumers, rather than requiring consumers
- 6 to take the required steps to change the post office box address
- 7 to a physical address. The legislature further finds that
- 8 making this change would promote more efficiency and
- 9 effectiveness in the timely delivery of prescriptions to
- 10 consumers.
- 11 The purpose of this Act is to allow the use of a post
- 12 office box for purposes of prescription delivery so long as the
- 13 dispensing pharmacy has the physical location where an
- 14 individual resides on file.
- 15 SECTION 2. Section 329-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 16 amended by amending the definition of "address" to read as
- 17 follows:

1 ""Address" means, with respect to prescriptions, the physical location where an individual resides, such as: 2 3 Street address, city, and state; (1)4 (2) Tax map key number; or 5 (3) The description of a physical location. 6 Unless the context dictates otherwise, "address" includes a post 7 office box; provided that the pharmacy dispensing the 8 prescription has the physical location where an individual 9 resides on file." 10 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored. SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2060. 11 12
