A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SPORTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that students who
- 2 participate in interscholastic athletic activities experience a
- 3 variety of benefits including increased academic success,
- 4 improved physical health, improved leadership and teamwork
- 5 abilities, a greater sense of accountability and responsibility,
- 6 improved concentration, higher self-esteem and self-confidence,
- 7 reduced likelihood of using drugs, lower likelihood of dropping
- 8 out of school, and a reduced suicide rate. Student-athletes
- 9 often spend more time with their coaches than their teachers,
- 10 and coaches can instill important life skills on youth,
- 11 especially youth that do not readily thrive in an academic
- 12 setting.
- 13 The purpose of this Act is to designate existing
- 14 interscholastic sports as co-curricular activities, instead of
- 15 extracurricular activities, so that they are considered to have
- 16 an essential status within the department of education.

- 1 SECTION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by adding a new section to part I, subpart B to be
- 3 appropriately designated and to read as follows:
- 4 "§302A- Co-curricular activities; sports. (a) Any
- 5 sport recognized by the department shall be considered a
- 6 co-curricular activity, including air riflery, baseball,
- 7 basketball, bowling, canoe paddling, cheerleading, cross country
- 8 running, diving, football, golf, judo, soccer, soft tennis,
- 9 softball, surfing, swimming, tennis, track and field,
- 10 volleyball, water polo, and wrestling.
- 11 (b) The department shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter
- 12 91 to implement sports as co-curricular activities under this
- 13 section."
- 14 SECTION 3. Section 302A-101, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 15 amended by adding four new definitions to be appropriately
- 16 inserted and to read as follows:
- ""Curriculum" means a plan that outlines what students
- 18 shall be taught and includes all the courses offered or all the
- 19 courses offered in a particular area of study.
- "Curricular activity" means any activity that is a part of
- 21 the curriculum.

•	co carried activity means any activity that is outside
2	of, but usually complements, the curriculum.
3	"Extracurricular activity" means any school-based activity
4	that is not tied to the curriculum."
5	SECTION 4. The department of education shall study and
6	estimate the cost, if any, of implementing sports as co-
7	curricular activities. The department of education shall submit
8	a report of its findings and recommendations, including any
9	proposed legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty
0	days prior to the convening of the regular session of 2023.
1	SECTION 5. New statutory material is underscored.
2	SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2022.
