A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO VOLUNTEER MONTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that statistics released
- 2 in November 2018 by the Corporation for National and Community
- 3 Service also known as Americorps, show that approximately
- 4 seventy-seven million Americans volunteered a total of nearly
- 5 seven billion hours in 2017, which is estimated to be worth one
- 6 hundred sixty-seven billion dollars in value.
- 7 The legislature acknowledges that many public agencies and
- 8 private organizations in small towns, rural counties, and even
- 9 the largest cities, would not be able to function without the
- 10 services provided by volunteers. From the anonymous volunteers
- 11 who donate their resources to those whose efforts are part of a
- 12 national organization or local grassroots group, their missions
- 13 provide valuable support to communities in times of need,
- 14 including services such as fundraising; preparing, distributing,
- 15 or serving food; mentoring youth; engaging in general labor;
- 16 supplying transportation; providing professional or management
- 17 assistance; supporting and staffing fire and ambulance

- 1 departments; and providing medical care. The legislature also
- 2 recognizes that volunteerism strengthens the foundation of
- 3 neighborhoods and communities, as it magnifies one's ability to
- 4 perform good works and contribute to the greater good, and
- 5 creates social momentum that increases the volunteer's desire to
- 6 engage fully with the community.
- 7 The legislature also finds that in 1974, the United States
- 8 through presidential proclamation, designated the third week of
- 9 April as National Volunteer Week to support, extend, and enhance
- 10 the vital and valuable services offered by volunteers. Since
- 11 then, National Volunteer Week has grown exponentially with
- 12 thousands of volunteer projects and special events scheduled
- 13 throughout the week. The legislature also acknowledges that in
- 14 1991, the month of April became National Volunteer Month as part
- 15 of President George H. W. Bush's A Thousand Points of Light
- 16 campaign, as a month dedicated to honoring the volunteers in
- 17 communities and encouraging volunteerism.
- 18 The selfless dedication of services by volunteers in the
- 19 country has been essential, especially while the nation
- 20 confronted and continues to recover from the disturbances caused
- 21 by the coronavirus disease 2019 pandemic. Countless individuals

- 1 volunteered their time, effort, and skills to administer
- 2 vaccines; staff vaccination centers; conduct testing and contact
- 3 tracing; and provide food, water, and other necessities to
- 4 individuals who were required to stay home during this hardship.
- 5 In recognition of the enduring contributions of these
- 6 volunteers, on April 16, 2021, the current administration issued
- 7 a proclamation designating April 18 through April 24, 2021, as
- 8 National Volunteer Week, calling upon all Americans to observe
- 9 the week by volunteering in service projects across the county
- 10 and pledging to make service a part of their daily lives.
- 11 The purpose of this Act is to designate the month of April
- 12 each year as the State's volunteer month to honor volunteers in
- 13 the community and encourage participation in service projects.
- 14 throughout the month.
- 15 SECTION 2. Chapter 8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
- 16 by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to
- 17 read as follows:
- 18 "§8- Volunteer Month. The month of April shall be known
- 19 and designated as "Volunteer Month" to honor volunteers in the
- 20 community and encourage participation in service projects

- 1 throughout the month. This month is not and shall not be
- 2 construed as a state holiday."
- 3 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
- 4 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
