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A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII STATE ARCHIVES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	PART I
2	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the state archives
3	contains records and primary source documents relating to the
4	rich culture and history of Hawaii and Native Hawaiians. As the
5	State's largest memory institution, the state archives is open
6	to the public and offers various services, including responding
7	to requests from other government agencies. While developments
8	in technology reduced the need for certain positions in the
9	archives division, the mission and services of the state
10	archives have not changed, and the need for staff has grown due
11	to a backlog of transferred and acquired materials and an
12	increase in public contact.
13	Therefore, the purpose of this part is to appropriate funds
14	for additional staff positions in the state archives to assist
15	with its mission and increase public access to historical
16	documents and artifacts.

1 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general 2 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so 3 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 for 4 the establishment of staff positions in the Hawaii state 5 archives as follows: 6 (1)One assistant Hawaiian language specialist position; 7 (2) Two processing and acquisitions archivist positions; 8 (3) One audio-visual archivist position; 9 (4)One objects curator position; 10 (5) One acquisitions position; 11 (6) One registration and public services position; 12 (7) Two assistant digital specialist positions; and 13 One security guard position. (8) 14 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of 15 accounting and general services for the purposes of this part. 16 PART II 17 SECTION 3. The legislature finds that the original state 18 archives building, known as the Kanaina building, was built in 19 1905 on the Iolani Palace grounds within the Hawaii capital historic district to house the public archives of Hawaii. After 20 21 many years of collecting the most important records and

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- 1 artifacts from the Hawaiian kingdom through statehood, the state
- 2 archives eventually outgrew the Kanaina building and in 1952, a
- 3 new building adjacent to the Kanaina building was constructed as
- 4 the new home of the state archives and named after Kekauluohi.
- 5 The legislature further finds that there exists a need to
- 6 promote citizen engagement in the documentary and tangible
- 7 artifact heritage of the government, provide greater education
- 8 of the history of Hawaii's governments and its people, and
- 9 assist the people of Hawaii in connecting with their personal
- 10 history, as well as the history of Hawaii, for the state
- 11 archives to fulfill its role as the keeper of the public memory.
- 12 There also exists a need to have dedicated exhibition space
- 13 to highlight the many historic records and artifacts preserved
- 14 in the public archives that document the vibrant and diverse
- 15 history of Hawaii, its public institutions, and its people.
- 16 The purpose of this part is to provide funding for the
- 17 construction of an additional building to address the current
- 18 and future facilities needs of the state archives.
- 19 SECTION 4. The director of finance is authorized to issue
- 20 general obligation bonds in the sum of \$ or so much
- 21 thereof as may be necessary and the same sum or so much thereof

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- 1 as may be necessary is appropriated for fiscal year 2022-2023
- 2 for the purpose of financing the construction of an additional
- 3 building for the state archives to expand and create new spaces
- 4 for collections processing, storage, administrative use, public
- 5 research, exhibitions, listening, learning, and community
- 6 engagement.
- 7 SECTION 5. The sum appropriated for the capital
- 8 improvement project set forth in section 4 shall be expended by
- 9 the department of accounting and general services for the
- 10 purposes of this part.
- 11 SECTION 6. The appropriation made for the capital
- 12 improvement project authorized by this part shall not lapse at
- 13 the end of the fiscal biennium for which the appropriation is
- 14 made; provided that all moneys from the appropriation
- 15 unencumbered as of June 30, 2024, shall lapse as of that date.

- 17 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
