

A BILL FOR AN ACT

PROPOSING AMENDMENTS TO ARTICLES VIII OF THE CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE OF HAWAII TO AUTHORIZE THE LEGISLATURE TO FREEZE ANY INCREASE IN STATE RESIDENTIAL PROPERTY TAX.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the residents of
- 2 Hawaii have been finding it increasingly difficult to purchase
- 3 and own a home. The legislature further finds that the median
- 4 price of a single-family home on Oahu is surpassing \$1,060,000.
- 5 The legislature also finds that the average age of owner-
- 6 occupied housing units is fifty-eight years of age and is
- 7 expected to increase in the most recent census count.
- 8 The legislature further finds if homeowners over the age of
- 9 fifty-five were allowed to transfer the assessed value of their
- 10 present home to their children without a property tax re-
- 11 assessment, the ability for our citizens to keep their homes in
- 12 the family would greatly increase.
- 13 The legislature additionally finds that Hawaii boasts some
- 14 of the lowest property tax rates in the country, which
- 15 contributes to the desire to buy and own homes locally.

- 1 Therefore, the intent of this Act is to hold intact our 2 favorable property tax rates by authorizing the legislature to 3 freeze any increases to the residential property tax. 4 SECTION 2. The purpose of this Act is to amend article 5 VIII, section 3, of the Constitution of the State of Hawaii to 6 relieve the financial burden of our homeowners in the State of 7 Hawaii who are over the age of fifty-five by authorizing the 8 legislature to establish a property tax freeze on residential
- SECTION 3. Article VIII, section 3, of the Constitution of the State of Hawaii is amended to read as follows:

12 "TAXATION AND FINANCE

13 SECTION 3. The taxing power shall be reserved to the 14 State, except so much thereof as may be delegated by the 15 legislature to the political subdivisions, and except that all 16 functions, powers and duties relating to the taxation of real 17 property shall be exercised exclusively by the counties, with 18 the exception of the county of Kalawao[-]; provided that the 19 legislature shall not be prohibited from establishing a property **20** tax freeze on residential property pursuant to Article VIII,
