A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ADULT PROTECTIVE SERVICES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that reports of abuse
- 2 against vulnerable adults continue to rise as Hawaii's
- 3 population ages. The department of human services is authorized
- 4 to enter premises without a warrant for purposes of
- 5 investigation of abuse of vulnerable adults, pursuant to section
- 6 346-229, Hawaii Revised Statutes. Existing law limits that
- 7 right of warrantless entry only to situations in which there is
- 8 probable cause to believe that a vulnerable adult will be
- 9 physically injured.
- 10 The legislature further finds that under existing law
- 11 related to the department of human services, "abuse" includes
- 12 not only physical abuse, but also psychological abuse, sexual
- 13 abuse, financial exploitation, caregiver neglect, or self-
- 14 neglect. All of these forms of abuse can result in damaging
- 15 losses to the vulnerable adult's mental health, welfare, and
- 16 financial stability. Additionally, vulnerable adults may suffer
- 17 multiple forms of abuse in combination.

- 1 The purpose of this Act is to broaden the department's
- 2 right of entry into a vulnerable adult's premises without a
- 3 warrant for an investigation of caregiver neglect, self-neglect,
- 4 or physical abuse.
- 5 SECTION 2. Section 346-229, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 6 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
- 7 "(b) Any employee of the department engaged in an
- 8 investigation under this part, having probable cause to believe
- 9 that a vulnerable adult will be [physically] injured through
- 10 caregiver neglect, self-neglect, or by physical abuse before a
- 11 court order for entry can be obtained, without a warrant, may
- 12 enter upon the premises where the vulnerable adult may be found
- 13 for the purpose of ascertaining that person's welfare. Where a
- 14 warrantless entry is authorized under this section, the employee
- 15 of the department may request the assistance of a police officer
- 16 to gain entrance."
- 17 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 18 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 19 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2060.
