## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO UNLAWFUL CHOP SHOP ACTIVITY.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that "chop shop" is street vernacular for a location where stolen motor vehicles, or 2 stolen motor vehicle parts, are taken to be altered to conceal 3 their true identity. Chop shop activity may include the theft 4 5 of motor vehicles and motor vehicle parts; defacing vehicle identification numbers; re-stamping false vehicle identification 7 numbers into stolen vehicles; and the re-sale of these stolen 8 vehicles to unsuspecting, innocent buyers. 9 The purpose of this Act is to establish the criminal 10 offense of unlawful chop shop activity and to provide for the forfeiture of property connected with chop shop activity. 11 12 SECTION 2. Chapter 708, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and 13 to read as follows: 14 15 "PART . UNLAWFUL CHOP SHOP ACTIVITY 16 §708-Definitions. As used in this part: "Chop shop" means: 17

1	(1)	Any building, lot, or other premises that is used to
2		store, destroy, dismantle, disassemble, or reassemble
3		a motor vehicle, or two or more motor vehicle parts,
4		that the person knows to have been stolen; or
5	(2)	Any building, lot, or other premises that is used to
6		alter, conceal, disguise, or remove the vehicle
7		identification number of at least one motor vehicle,
8		or two or more motor vehicle parts from at least one
9		motor vehicle, that the person knows to have been
10		stolen.
11	"Motor vehicle" means any automobile, motorcycle,	
12	motorboat	, or other motor-propelled vehicle.
13	"Vehicle identification number" means the number that the	
14	manufacturer or a governmental agency assigns to a motor vehicle	
15	for the purpose of identifying the motor vehicle or a major	
16	component part of the motor vehicle. "Vehicle identification	
17	number" includes any combination of numbers or letters.	
18	<b>§708</b>	- Unlawful chop shop activity. (1) A person
19	commits t	he offense of unlawful chop shop activity if the persor
20	knowingly:	
21	(a)	Owns or operates a chop shop;

1	(b)	Transports a stolen motor vehicle, or two or more
2		stolen motor vehicle parts, to or from a chop shop;
3	(c)	Sells or transfers to, or purchases or receives from a
4		chop shop, a stolen motor vehicle or two or more
5		stolen motor vehicle parts; or
6	(d)	Conducts or participates in the conduct of the affairs
7		of any chop shop by:
8		(i) Storing, destroying, dismantling, disassembling,
9		or reassembling a stolen motor vehicle, or two or
10		more stolen motor vehicle parts; or
11		(ii) Altering, concealing, disguising, or removing the
12		vehicle identification number of at least one
13		stolen motor vehicle, or two or more motor
14		vehicle parts from at least one stolen motor
15		vehicle.
16	(2)	Unlawful chop shop activity is a class C felony.
17	(3)	Each separate act committed under subsection (1)(a),
18	(b), (c),	or (d) shall constitute a separate offense.
19	§708	Forfeiture of property connected with chop shop
20	activity.	Any motor vehicle, motor vehicle part, tool,
21	implomont	or real property passaged or used in violation of

- 1 this part, or any money obtained in violation of this part, may
- 2 be ordered forfeited to the State, subject to the requirements
- 3 of chapter 712A."
- 4 SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 5 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 6 begun before its effective date.
- 7 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 30, 2075.
