## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO UNLAWFUL CHOP SHOP ACTIVITY.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that "chop shop" is			
2	street vernacular for a location where stolen motor vehicles, or			
3	stolen motor vehicle parts, are taken to be altered to conceal			
4	their true identity. Chop shop activity may include the theft			
5	of motor vehicles and motor vehicle parts; defacing vehicle			
6	identification numbers; re-stamping false vehicle identification			
7	numbers into stolen vehicles; and the re-sale of these stolen			
8	vehicles to unsuspecting, innocent buyers.			
9	The purpose of this Act is to establish the criminal			
10	offense of unlawful chop shop activity and to provide for the			
11	forfeiture of property connected with chop shop activity.			
12	SECTION 2. Chapter 708, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is			
13	amended by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and			
14	to read as follows:

17	§708- Definitions. As used in this part:			

1	"Chop shop" means:				
2	(1)	Any building, lot, or other premises that is used to			
3		store, destroy, dismantle, disassemble, or reassemble			
4		a motor vehicle, or two or more motor vehicle parts,			
5		that the person knows to have been stolen; or			
6	(2)	Any building, lot, or other premises that is used to			
7		alter, conceal, disguise, or remove the vehicle			
8		identification number of at least one motor vehicle,			
9		or two or more motor vehicle parts from at least one			
10		motor vehicle, that the person knows to have been			
11		stolen.			
12	"Mot	or vehicle" means any automobile, motorcycle,			
13	motorboat	, or other motor-propelled vehicle.			
14	"Veh	icle identification number" means the number that the			
15	manufacturer or a governmental agency assigns to a motor vehicle				
16	for the purpose of identifying the motor vehicle or a major				
17	component	part of the motor vehicle. "Vehicle identification			
18	number" i	ncludes any combination of numbers or letters.			
19	§708	- Unlawful chop shop activity. (1) A person			
20	commits t	he offense of unlawful chop shop activity if the person			
21	knowingly	:			

1	(a)	OWIIS	or operaces a chop shop;
2	(b)	Tran	sports a stolen motor vehicle, or two or more
3		stol	en motor vehicle parts, to or from a chop shop;
4	(c)	Sell	s or transfers to, or purchases or receives from a
5		chop	shop, a stolen motor vehicle or two or more
6		stol	en motor vehicle parts; or
7	(d)	Cond	ucts or participates in the conduct of the affairs
8		of a	ny chop shop by:
9		(i)	Storing, destroying, dismantling, disassembling,
10			or reassembling a stolen motor vehicle, or two or
11			more stolen motor vehicle parts; or
12		(ii)	Altering, concealing, disguising, or removing the
13			vehicle identification number of at least one
14			stolen motor vehicle, or two or more motor
15			vehicle parts from at least one stolen motor
16			vehicle.
17	(2)	Unla	wful chop shop activity is a misdemeanor.
18	§708	-	Forfeiture of property connected with chop shop
19	activity.	Any	motor vehicle, motor vehicle part, tool,
20	implement	, or	real property, possessed or used in violation of
21	this part	, or	any money obtained in violation of this part, may

- 1 be ordered forfeited to the State, subject to the requirements
- 2 of chapter 712A."
- 3 SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 4 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 5 begun before its effective date.
- 6 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 30, 2075.
