A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO STATE SMALL BOAT HARBORS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. Section 200-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 2 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 3 "§200-4 Rules. (a) The chairperson may adopt rules 4 necessary: To regulate the manner in which all vessels may enter 5 (1) the ocean waters and navigable streams of the State 6 7 and moor, anchor, or dock at small boat harbors, launching ramps, and other boating facilities owned or 8 9 controlled by the State; To regulate the embarking and disembarking of 10 (2) passengers at small boat harbors, launching ramps, 11 other boating facilities, and public beaches; 12 13 (3) For the safety of small boat harbors, launching ramps, 14
 - and other boating facilities, and the vessels anchored or moored therein;

- (5) To regulate and control recreational and commercial use of small boat harbors, launching ramps, and other boating facilities owned or controlled by the State and the ocean waters and navigable streams of the State:
- 9 (6) To prevent the discharge or throwing into small boat harbors, launching ramps, other boating facilities, ocean waters, and navigable streams, of rubbish, 11 refuse, garbage, or other substances likely to affect 12 13 the quality of the water or that contribute to making 14 the small boat harbors, launching ramps, other boating 15 facilities, ocean waters, and streams unsightly, 16 unhealthful, or unclean, or that are liable to fill 17 up, shoal, or shallow the waters in, near, or affecting small boat harbors, launching ramps, and 18 19 other boating facilities and the ocean waters and navigable streams of the State, and likewise to 20 21 prevent the escape of fuel or other oils or substances

1	into the waters in, near, or affecting small boat
2	harbors, launching ramps, or other boating facilities
3	and the ocean waters and navigable streams of the
4	State from any source point, including but not limited
5	to any vessel or from pipes or storage tanks upon
6	land, including:
7	(A) Requirements for permits and fees for:
8	(i) The mooring, docking, or anchoring of
9	recreational and commercial vessels or the
10	launching of recreational or commercial
11	vessels at small boat harbors, launching
12	ramps, and other boating facilities; or
13	(ii) Other uses of these facilities;
14	[(B) Requirements for permits and fees for use of a
15	vessel as a principal place of habitation while
16	moored at a state small boat harbor;
17	(C) (B) Requirements governing:
18	(i) The transfer of any state commercial,
19	mooring, launching, or any other type of use
20	or other permit, directly or indirectly,
21	including but not limited to the imposition

1			or assessment of a business transfer fee
2			upon transfer of ownership of vessels
3			operating commercially from, within or in
4			any way related to the state small boat
5			harbors; and
6		(ii)	The use of state small boat harbors,
7			launching ramps, or other boating facilities
8			belonging to or controlled by the State,
9			including but not limited to the
10			establishment of minimum amounts of annual
11			gross receipts required to renew a
12			commercial use permit, and conditions under
13			which a state commercial, mooring,
14			launching, or any other type of use or other
15			permit may be terminated, canceled, or
16			forfeited; and
17	[(D)] <u>(C)</u>	Any o	other rule necessary to implement this
18		chapt	ter pertaining to small boat harbors,
19		laund	ching ramps, and other boating facilities
20		belo	nging to or controlled by the State;

1	(7)	To continue the ocean recreational and coastal areas
2		programs and govern the ocean waters and navigable
3		streams of the State, and beaches encumbered with
4		easements in favor of the public to protect and foster
5		public peace and tranquility and to promote public
6		safety, health, and welfare in or on the ocean waters
7		and navigable streams of the State, and on beaches
8		encumbered with easements in favor of the public,
9		including:
10		(A) Regulating the anchoring and mooring of vessels,
11		houseboats, and other contrivances outside of any
12		harbor or boating facility, including:
13		(i) The designation of offshore mooring areas;
14		(ii) The licensing and registration of vessels,
15		houseboats, and other contrivances; and the
16		issuance of permits for offshore anchoring
17		and mooring of vessels, houseboats, and
18		other contrivances; and
19		(iii) The living aboard on vessels, houseboats, or
20		other contrivances while they are anchored

1		or moored within ocean waters or havigable
2		streams of the State.
3		The rules shall provide for consideration of
4		environmental impacts on the State's aquatic
5		resources in the issuance of any permits for
6		offshore mooring;
7	(B)	Safety measures, requirements, and practices in
8		or on the ocean waters and navigable streams of
9		the State;
10	(C)	The licensing and registration of persons or
11		organizations engaged in commercial activities in
12		or on the ocean waters and navigable streams of
13		the State;
14	(D)	The licensing and registration of equipment
15		utilized for commercial activities in or on the
16		ocean waters and navigable streams of the State;
17	(E)	For beaches encumbered with easements in favor of
18		the public, the prohibition or denial of the
19		following uses and activities:
20		(i) Commercial activities;

1		(ii) The storage, parking, and display of any
2		personal property;
3		(iii) The placement of structures or obstructions;
4		(iv) The beaching, landing, mooring, or anchoring
5		of any vessels; and
6		(v) Other uses or activities that may interfere
7		with the public use and enjoyment of these
8		beaches; and
9		(F) Any other matter relating to the safety, health,
10		and welfare of the general public;
11	(8)	To regulate the examination, guidance, and control of
12		harbor agents and their assistants; and
13	(9)	To regulate commercial activities in state waters
14		including operations originating from private marinas;
15		provided that no new or additional permits shall be
16		required for those commercial activities regulated by
17		any other chapter.
18		For the purposes of this paragraph:
19		"Commercial activity" means to engage in any
20		action or attempt to engage in any action for
21		compensation in any form. The action or actions may

1	include providing or attempting to provide guide
2	services, charters, tours, and transportation to and
3	from the location or locations for which such service
4	are provided.
5	"Compensation" means money, barter, trade,
6	credit, and other instruments of value, goods, and
7	other forms of payment."
8	SECTION 2. Section 200-9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
9	amended as follows:
10	1. By amending subsection (b) to read:
11	"(b) [Vessels used for purposes of recreational boating
12	activities that are also the principal habitation of the owners
13	shall occupy no more than one hundred twenty nine berths at Ala
14	Wai boat harbor and thirty five berths at Keehi boat harbor,
15	which is equal to fifteen per cent of the respective total
16	moorage space that was available as of July 1, 1976, at the Ala
17	Wai and Keehi boat harbors.] Use of vessels as the principal
18	habitation of any person shall be prohibited at all state small
19	boat harbors."
20	2. By amending subsection (d) to read:

1	(α)	Notwichstanding any limitations on commercial permits
2	for Maui	county small boat facilities, vessels engaging in
3	inter-isl	and ferry service within Maui county shall be afforded
4	preferent	ial consideration for [ferry landings, including] the
5	issuance	of a commercial operating permit [and the waiver of ang
6	applicabl	e fees,] at Maui county small boat facilities; provided
7	that:	
8	(1)	The vessel operator has been issued a certificate of
9		public convenience and necessity for the purpose of
10		engaging in inter-island ferry service that includes a
11		route within Maui county;
12	(2)	The design and performance characteristics of the
13		vessel will permit safe navigation within the harbor
14		entrance channel and safe docking within Maui county
15		small boat facilities;
16	(3)	The vessel operations will not result in unreasonable
17		interference with the use of Maui county small boat
18		facilities by other vessels; and
19	(4)	All preferential consideration [and waivers],
20		including any commercial permits issued under this
21		section, shall cease upon the vessel operator's

1		termination of inter-island ferry service within Maul
2		county."
3	SECT	ION 3. Section 200-10, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4	amended b	y amending subsection (c) to read as follows:
5	"(c)	The permittee shall pay moorage fees to the
6	departmen	t for the use permit that shall be based on but not
7	limited t	o the use of the vessel, the vessel's effect on the
8	harbor, u	se of facilities, and the cost of administering the
9	mooring p	rogram; provided that:
10	(1)	Except for commercial maritime activities in which a
11		tariff is established by the department of
12		transportation, moorage fees shall be established by
13		appraisal by a state-licensed appraiser approved by
14		the department;
15	(2)	For commercial maritime activities in which a tariff
16		is established by the harbors division of the
17		department of transportation, the department may adopt
18		the published tariff of the harbors division of the
19		department of transportation or establish the fee by
20		appraisal by a state-licensed appraiser approved by
21		the department;

1	(3)	An application fee shall be collected when applying
2		for moorage in state small boat harbors and shall
3		thereafter be collected annually when the application
4		is renewed; provided that the application fee shall be
5		set by the department;
6	(4)	[If a recreational vessel is used as a place of
7		principal habitation, the permittee shall pay, in lieu
8		of the moorage fee required by paragraph (1), a
9		monthly liveaboard fee that shall be two times the
10		moorage fee that would otherwise be assessed for a
11		vessel of the same size;
12	(5)]	If a vessel is used for commercial purposes from the
13		vessel's permitted mooring, the permittee shall pay,
14		in lieu of the moorage fee required by paragraph (1),
15		a monthly fee that shall be the greater of:
16		(A) Three per cent of the gross revenues derived from
17		the use of the vessel;
18		(B) \$1.50 per passenger carried for hire; or
19		(C) Two times the moorage fee that would otherwise be
20		assessed for a recreational vessel of the same
21		size;



1	[(6)]	(5) The department is authorized to assess and
2		collect utility fees, including electrical and water
3		charges, and common-area maintenance fees in small
4		boat harbors; and
5	[(7)]	(6) All fees established by appraisal pursuant to
6		this subsection shall be set at fair market value."
7	SECT:	ION 4. Section 200-11, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
8	repealed.	
9	[" [\$;	200-11] Existing permits. An owner of a vessel used
10	as a prin	sipal place of habitation holding a permit for that use
11	in a state	small boat ha3rbor on June 9, 1976, may continue to
12	moor the	vessel in that harbor for such purpose and be permitted
13	to obtain	a new mooring permit; provided that the owner conforms
14	to condit:	ions set forth in sections 200 9 and 200 10."]
