A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC NOTICES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to provide
- 2 government agencies the option to publish notice via a posting
- 3 on their official website, in lieu of or in addition to
- 4 publication in daily or weekly publication, such as a printed
- 5 newspaper. Electronic posting is more expedient and
- 6 cost-effective, particularly for routine but time-sensitive
- 7 situations, such as postings of clean water environmental hazard
- 8 advisories, as well as in more urgent conditions, such as
- 9 disaster-related response and recovery activities.
- 10 The legislature affirms that under general rules of
- 11 statutory construction, where two statutes conflict, the more
- 12 specific statute is followed. As a result, since section
- 13 1-28.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is a general statute, this Act
- 14 is not intended to supersede procedures that, for example,
- 15 assure transparency in public administration, such as chapter
- 16 91, Hawaii Revised Statutes, "Administration Procedures," and

1	chapter 92, Hawaii Revised Statutes, "Public Agency Meetings and
2	Records."
3	SECTION 2. Section 1-28.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4	amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
5	"(a) Notwithstanding any other statute, law, charter
6	provision, ordinance, or rule to the contrary, whenever a
7	government agency is required to give public notice or to
8	publish notice, the notice shall be given only as follows:
9	(1) For statewide publication:
10	(A) In a daily or weekly publication of statewide
11	circulation; or
12	(B) By publication in separate daily or weekly
13	publications whose combined circulation is
14	statewide; [and]
15	(2) For county-wide publication, by publication in a daily
16	or weekly publication in the affected county[-
17	Additional supplemental notice may also be given through Hawaii
18	FYI, the State's interactive computer system.]; or
19	(3) For statewide or county publication of public notices,
20	as applicable, by posting on an electronic calendar or
21	an official website for legal notices maintained by

1	the :	State or the appropriate county; provided that the
2	gove	rnment agency shall:
3	(A)	Evaluate and document the rationale for posting
4		only online if the subject of the public notice
5		is likely to impact persons with limited,
6		inconsistent, or unreliable broadband access or
7		significant inexperience with broadband-enabled
8		telecommunications;
9	(B)	Post documents in accessible formats on an
10		accessible official website; and
11	(C)	Provide a disclaimer in any public notice from
12		January 1, 2023, through June 30, 2023, that
13		states that the government agency may begin to
14		post online after July 1, 2023."
15	SECTION 3	. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
16	and stricken.	New statutory material is underscored.
17	SECTION 4	. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
