A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TEMPORARY ASSISTANCE FOR NEEDY FAMILIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the temporary
 2 assistance for needy families (TANF) program is a federally
- 3 funded financial assistance program designed to help families in
- 4 need achieve self-sufficiency. The temporary assistance for
- 5 other needy families (TAONF) program, is a state funded program
- 6 that mirrors the rules of TANF and is designed to assist Hawaii
- 7 families with minor children who are not eligible to receive
- $8\,$ TANF program benefits due to their citizenship. Both programs
- 9 provide for sixty months of assistance, though most families in
- 10 Hawaii participate in the programs for approximately twenty-four
- 11 months. The funds appropriated for the TAONF program make up a
- 12 significant percentage of Hawaii's maintenance of effort
- 13 required to receive federal program funds.
- 14 For both programs, recipients must participate in the
- 15 first-to-work program as a condition of eligibility. The first-
- 16 to-work program assists recipient families to obtain employment
- 17 through various educational and work-related activities. First-

- 1 to-work participants may be eligible for supportive services
- 2 such as job readiness support, education and work-related
- 3 expenses, and transportation assistance.
- 4 The legislature finds that under existing administrative
- 5 rules for the first-to-work program, participants may receive a
- 6 maximum housing allowance equal to sixty per cent of the
- 7 household income. However, only a one-time payment in an amount
- 8 not more than two months of rent is currently permitted.
- 9 The legislature further finds that of the \$98,000,000 block
- 10 grant that the State receives each year for the TANF program,
- 11 approximately \$41,000,000 is encumbered. Approximately
- 12 \$57,000,000 of the remaining balance is placed in a reserve
- 13 account held for the State by the federal government.
- 14 The legislature finds that low-income residents
- 15 participating in the first-to-work program likely need
- 16 assistance to meet their housing costs. In December 2021, the
- 17 United States Bureau of Labor Statistics reported that the
- 18 average housing cost for Honolulu-area households is \$23,572 per
- 19 year and accounts for 38.7 per cent of the area's household
- 20 budget, compared to the 33.8 per cent United States average.
- 21 Additionally, the National Low Income Housing Coalition ranked

- 1 Hawaii as the state with the highest living wage needed to
- 2 afford a two-bedroom rental home. The Coalition estimates that
- 3 twenty per cent of Hawaii's low-income residents and sixty-nine
- 4 per cent of severely low-income residents pay more than fifty
- 5 per cent of their household income on rent.
- 6 The legislature also finds that the 2021 median prices for
- 7 single-family homes and condominiums in Hawaii are at record
- 8 highs. Reports from the housing industry predict that rising
- 9 home values have led property owners to consider selling, which
- 10 may result in displacing long-term tenants and decrease the
- 11 number of available rental units. With fewer available rental
- 12 units, rents will likely increase.
- 13 The purpose of this Act is to authorize and appropriate
- 14 funds for the department of human services to provide additional
- 15 housing assistance subsidies to recipients of temporary
- 16 assistance for needy families or temporary assistance for other
- 17 needy families benefits who are participants of the first-to-
- 18 work program.
- 19 SECTION 2. Section 346-261, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 20 amended to read as follows:

1 "§346-261 First-To-Work; establishment; purpose. (a) 2 There is established a mandatory work program for certain 3 applicants and recipients of temporary assistance for needy families and temporary assistance for other needy families 4 consistent with federal regulations and requirements under title 5 6 [IV-A] IV, part A of the Social Security Act, title 42 United 7 States Code section 601 et seq. The purposes of the first-to-8 work program shall be to encourage, assist, and require 9 temporary assistance for needy families and temporary assistance 10 for other needy families applicants and recipients to fulfill 11 their responsibilities to support their children by preparing for, accepting, and retaining employment. The department shall 12 adopt rules consistent with the requirements of title [HV-A] IV, 13 part A of the Social Security Act, title 42 United States Code 14 15 section 601 et seq., and in accordance with chapter 91 for the 16 purposes of this part. (b) The department may provide eligible households 17 receiving benefits under the temporary assistance for needy 18 19 families or temporary assistance for other needy families 20 programs with housing assistance subsidies of up to \$500 per month during their participation in the first-to-work program. 21

- 1 Any plan for expenditure of temporary assistance for needy
- 2 families funds developed pursuant to section 346-51.5 shall be
- 3 updated to account for expenditures for housing assistance
- 4 subsidies. Expenditure of funds for the administration of
- 5 housing assistance subsidies shall be exempt from chapters 103D
- 6 and 103F."
- 7 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 8 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$3,557,520 or so much
- 9 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 to fund
- 10 the housing assistance subsidies for the temporary assistance
- 11 for other needy families program.
- 12 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 13 human services for the purposes of this Act.
- 14 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the federal funds
- 15 received by the State of Hawaii the sum of \$16,206,480 or so
- 16 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 to
- 17 fund the housing assistance subsidies for temporary assistance
- 18 for needy families program participants.
- 19 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 20 human services for the purposes of this Act.

- 1 SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general
- 2 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$200,000 or so much
- 3 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 for the
- 4 department of human services to make enhancements to its case
- 5 management and payment system to implement this Act.
- 6 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 7 human services for the purposes of this Act.
- 8 SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 9 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 10 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on December 31,
- 2050.
