RELATING TO SERVICE ANIMALS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 347-2.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 "\$347-2.5 Service animal, defined. As used in this
- 4 chapter, "service animal" means any dog that is individually
- 5 trained to do work or perform tasks for the benefit of an
- 6 individual with a disability, including a physical, sensory,
- 7 psychiatric, intellectual, anxiety, emotional disorder, or other
- 8 mental disability. Other species of animals, whether wild or
- 9 domestic, trained or untrained, are not service animals for the
- 10 purposes of this definition. The work or tasks performed by a
- 11 service animal must relate directly to the individual's
- 12 disability. Neither the potential crime deterrent effects of an
- animal's presence nor the provision of [emotional support,]
- 14 comfort $[\tau]$ or companionship by an animal constitutes work or
- 15 tasks for the purposes of this definition."
- 16 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 17 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

1 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
