A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TOURISM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that since the
- 2 implementation of the safe travels Hawaii program in October of
- 3 2020, there has been a steady increase of visitors to the State.
- 4 Visitor activities can impact the natural resources of the
- 5 islands, including endangered and indigenous species. Indeed,
- 6 there has been a rise in the number of incidents of visitors
- disrupting the State's protected areas and wildlife. Around the 7
- 8 summer of 2021, there were at least two reported instances of
- 9 visitors being investigated and fined for touching Hawaiian monk
- 10 seals and one reported incident of a visitor lifting a green sea
- turtle out of the water. Both of which are critically 11
- 12 endangered species.
- 13 The purpose of this Act is to require the Hawaii tourism
- 14 authority, in collaboration with the department of land and
- 15 natural resources, to implement and administer tourism related
- 16 initiatives that are designed to educate visitors on the State's
- 17 protected areas and wildlife.



1	SECTION 2. Chapter 197, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	"§197- Promise to preserve and protect Hawaii's
5	environment. (a) All aircraft and vessel passengers entering
6	the State shall sign a declaration form entitled "Promise to
7	Preserve and Protect Hawaii's Environment" wherein the
8	passengers shall agree to preserve and protect Hawaii's unique
9	and fragile environment by complying with the laws protecting
10	endangered species and acknowledging the information contained
11	in the public service announcements shown under initiatives
12	administered pursuant to section 201B-7(b)(6)(B). Any person
13	who defaces the declaration form required under this section,
14	gives false information, or fails to complete the declaration
15	form is in violation of this section.
16	(b) It shall be the responsibility of the transportation
17	company to distribute, prior to the debarkation of passengers
18	and baggage, the "Promise to Preserve and Protect Hawaii's
19	Environment" declaration form to each passenger of any aircraft
20	or vessel originating in the continental United States or its
21	possessions or from any other area not under the jurisdiction of

comply with this section. All passengers shall complete the 2 3 declaration form, except that one adult member of a family may 4 complete the declaration form for other family members. Failure 5 to comply with this requirement is a violation of this section. 6 (c) Completed declaration forms shall be collected by the 7 transportation company and be delivered to the department. Failure to distribute or collect declaration forms or to deliver 8 9 completed forms is a violation of this section. 10 (d) Any person who violates this section shall be subject 11 to a fine not to exceed \$ per violation. 12 The department may adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91 to implement this section." 13 14 SECTION 3. Section 201B-7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 15 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows: 16 "(b) The authority shall be responsible for: 17 (1) Creating a vision and developing a long-range

6		init	iatives, in collaboration with the department of
7		land	and natural resources, that are designed to
8		educ	ate visitors on the State's protected areas and
9		wild	life that shall include the following:
10		(A)	Creating public service announcement videos for
11			transportation companies to play for passengers
12			arriving in the State to educate visitors on the
13			State's protected areas and endangered and
14			endemic wildlife, conservation of the State's
15			resources, and compliance with state laws;
16		<u>(B)</u>	Requiring transportation companies arriving in
17			the State to play the public service
18			announcements provided by the authority to
19			educate visitors on the State's protected areas
20			and endangered and endemic wildlife, conservation

1			of the State's resources, and compliance with
2			state laws prior to landing; and
3		<u>(C)</u>	Requiring passengers of transportation companies
4			arriving in the State to sign a "Promise to
5			Preserve and Protect Hawaii's Environment"
6			declaration form wherein the passenger agrees to
7			preserve and protect Hawaii's unique and fragile
8			environment by complying with the federal and
9			state laws protecting endangered species and
10			acknowledging the information contained in the
11			public service announcements pursuant to section
12			197- ; and
13	[(6)]	(7)	Reviewing annually the expenditure of public
14		fund	s by any visitor industry organization that
15		cont	racts with the authority to perform tourism
16		prom	otion, marketing, and development and making
17		reco	mmendations necessary to ensure the effective use
18		of t	he funds for the development of tourism."

Description:

Requires the Hawaii Tourism Authority, in collaboration with the Department of Land and Natural Resources, to implement and administer tourism related initiatives that are designed to educate visitors on the State's protected areas and wildlife, including public service announcement videos to be shown by transportation companies. Requires aircraft and vessel passengers to complete "Promise to Preserve and Protect Hawaii's Environment" declaration forms. Requires transportation companies to distribute and collect declaration forms for delivery to the Department of Land and Natural Resources.
