A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO DENTAL ASSISTANTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. The legislature finds that, according to a 2016
 report by the department of health, nearly one in four third
 graders in Hawaii has untreated tooth decay, the highest rate in
- 4 the nation. More than sixty per cent of all children in Hawaii
- 5 lack protective dental sealants, which are a safe and cost-
- 6 effective intervention to prevent tooth decay in molar teeth.
- 7 The legislature further finds that this lack of access to
- $oldsymbol{8}$ sufficient dental care has led to devastating health outcomes
- 9 among children, especially those in Native Hawaiian and Pacific
- 10 Islander communities. The high rate of tooth decay among
- 11 Hawaii's keiki can lead to significant pain that interferes with
- 12 daily activities, such as eating, learning, and socializing.
- 13 Untreated cavities also increase the risk of more serious
- 14 infection in the mouth and body.
- 15 The legislature also finds that the State lacks adequate
- 16 and accessible dental public health infrastructure, especially
- 17 on the neighbor islands. The 2015 Hawaii Oral Health Key

- 1 Findings report by the department of health suggests multiple
- 2 strategies to address the lack of adequate dental public health
- 3 infrastructure, including the development of community and
- 4 school-based dental disease prevention programs for all age
- 5 groups, continued support and expansion of affordable and
- 6 accessible preventive dental care services to the State's low-
- 7 income population, and further exploration of innovative,
- 8 evidence-based strategies to expand access to underserved, high-
- 9 risk populations.
- 10 The legislature additionally finds that dental assistants
- 11 could play an important role in improving access to dental
- 12 health care across the State. Although the Hawaii Dental
- 13 Practice Act allows dental hygienists to practice under the
- 14 general supervision of a dentist in public health settings,
- 15 dental assistants are prohibited from providing auxiliary
- 16 support except under direct supervision. This undermines the
- 17 efficacy of dental assistants in public health settings and
- 18 limits the reach and sustainability of community dental
- 19 programs.
- The legislature further finds that, according to the Oral
- 21 Health Workforce Research Center, eight states, including

- 1 Alaska, Arizona, Maine, Maryland, Nebraska, New Mexico, Oregon,
- 2 and Wyoming, allow dental assistants to perform some tasks under
- 3 indirect or general supervision without licensure, registration,
- 4 or representation on the state board of dentistry. Allowing
- 5 dental assistants to provide limited, but essential, auxiliary
- 6 support under general supervision while in public health
- 7 settings would contribute to the development and sustainable
- 8 implementation of community-based dental disease prevention
- 9 programs. This would also expand providers' ability to offer
- 10 adequate and accessible oral health services to rural
- 11 communities and the State's most vulnerable residents.
- 12 The purpose of this Act is to allow dental assistants to
- 13 perform limited, essential duties under the general supervision
- 14 of a dentist in public health settings.
- 15 SECTION 2. Chapter 448, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 16 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 17 and to read as follows:
- 18 "§448- Supervision in public health settings. (a) A
- 19 dental assistant may operate under the general supervision of
- 20 any dentist licensed under this chapter to provide auxiliary
- 21 support dental services in a public health setting.

14	(1) Taking intra-oral and extra-oral photographs, and					
15		recording or charting clinical findings as directed by				
16		the licensed dental hygienist;				
17	(2)	Exposing, processing, mounting, and labeling				
18		radiographs;				
19	(3)	Measuring and recording vital signs;				
20	(4)	Assisting the licensed dental hygienist who is				
21		performing a dental procedure on a patient such as:
