## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE RESEARCH CORPORATION OF THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the research
- 2 corporation of the University of Hawaii, a public
- 3 instrumentality of the State that is administratively attached
- 4 to the University of Hawaii, was established in 1965 for the
- 5 purposes of promoting, encouraging, initiating, developing, and
- 6 conducting scientific research and investigation in all branches
- 7 of learning, and disseminating to the public, the benefits of
- 8 such research and investigation.
- 9 To promote cooperative research projects with private firms
- 10 and persons, the legislature at the time granted the research
- 11 corporation of the University of Hawaii with flexibility in the
- 12 hiring of its personnel and the handling and disbursement of
- 13 moneys by exempting it from state laws relating to reimbursement
- 14 of special funds to the state general funds; advertisement for
- 15 bids and purchases to be made in Hawaii whenever public moneys
- 16 are expended; civil service; compensation; and public

- 1 employment. The legislature finds, however, that over the
- 2 years, the research corporation of the University of Hawaii has
- 3 gradually expanded its undertakings into areas beyond its
- 4 original eponymous purpose, and the benefits of the exemptions
- 5 from statutory requirements have been extended to apply beyond
- 6 what was originally intended by the legislature. For example,
- 7 the research corporation's current website provides that one of
- 8 its missions is to "support and enhance . . . development" in
- 9 Hawaii.
- 10 The purpose of this Act is to clarify that the purpose of
- 11 the research corporation of the University of Hawaii is to
- 12 promote educational, scientific, and literary pursuits through
- 13 research, training of research personnel, and dissemination of
- 14 knowledge by publication of research findings, and its
- 15 undertakings shall be limited to acts that are reasonably
- 16 necessary to carry out this purpose.
- 17 SECTION 2. Section 304A-112, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 18 amended to read as follows:
- "[+] §304A-112[+] Contracts for services provided by the
- 20 research corporation of the University of Hawaii. (a)
- 21 Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, when the university

- 1 determines that neither the university nor another state agency
- 2 can more effectively or efficiently accomplish the purposes of
- 3 the sponsored research and training activities, the university
- 4 shall contract with the research corporation of the University
- 5 of Hawaii established under section [+]304A-3001[+] to provide
- 6 management and other services as described in subsection (b) to
- 7 support the university's research and training activities.
- 8 Contracts by the university with the research corporation
- 9 pursuant to this section shall be limited to sponsored research
- 10 and training projects; except that [university projects
- 11 supported by funds appropriated by the legislature may also be
- 12 contracted to the research corporation [pursuant to rules
- 13 adopted by the board of regents.] for purposes of supporting or
- 14 facilitating sponsored research and training activities or for
- 15 advancing innovation and entrepreneurship in the State.
- 16 (b) Management and other support services provided by the
- 17 research corporation pursuant to this section may include:
- 18 (1) The procurement of goods and services;
- 19 (2) Employment of personnel; and
- 20 (3) The provision of advance funding for research and
- training contracts and grants.

- 1 These services may be provided by the corporation to the
- 2 university without regard to chapter 76, 78, 89, or 103D.
- 3 (c) The university shall, for employment of personnel,
- 4 consult with employee unions to review conformance of positions
- 5 with exceptions to collective bargaining. The corporation shall
- 6 not supplant civil servants, and if any civil servants or
- 7 programs actively employ civil servants, the corporation shall
- 8 provide justification for each civil service position accepted
- 9 and list the program affected and require approval from the
- 10 Governor. The corporation shall report quarterly and annually
- 11 to the Legislature."
- 12 SECTION 3. Section 304A-3001, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 13 amended to read as follows:
- 14 "[+]\$304A-3001[+] Establishment of the research
- 15 corporation; purpose. (a) There is established as a body
- 16 corporate, the research corporation of the University of Hawaii.
- 17 The research corporation shall be a public instrumentality and
- 18 shall be a part of the University of Hawaii for administrative
- 19 purposes pursuant to section 26-35.
- 20 (b) The purposes of the research corporation shall
- 21 [include, but not be limited to,] be the promotion of [all]

6	SECT	ION 4. Section 304A-3003, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
7	amended to	o read as follows:

9	The resea	rch corporation, under the direction of the board of
10	directors	, shall have the following general powers:
11	(1)	To adopt, amend, and repeal bylaws governing the
12		conduct of its business and the exercise of the powers
13		and performance of duties granted to or imposed upon
14		it by law;
15	(2)	To sell, lease, rent, hold, maintain, use, and operate
16		any property, real, personal, or mixed, tangible or
17		intangible, in accordance with the conditions under
18		which it was received;
19	(3)	To enter into and perform such contracts, leases,
20		cooperative agreements, or other transactions with the
21		university or any other agency or political

subdivision of the State, any private person, firm,
partnership, association, company, or corporation,
only [as it may be] when the board of directors
determines that doing so is necessary in the conduct
of [its] the research corporation's business of
research, training of research personnel, and
publication of research findings, and only on [such]
terms [as it may deem] that the board of directors
deems reasonable and appropriate; provided that the
research corporation shall not obligate any funds of
the State except those that have been appropriated to
it.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, the research corporation may enter into and perform such contracts, leases, cooperative agreements, or other transactions with any agency or instrumentality of the United States, a foreign nation, a state, a territory, or a possession, or with any political subdivision thereof, for research, training of research personnel, or publication of research findings, whenever the donating or granting agency or instrumentality

(4) To receive by gifts, grants, devises, bequests, or otherwise from private sources only, any property, real, personal, or mixed, intangible or tangible, absolutely or in trust, to be used and disposed of, either the principal or the income therefrom, in accordance with the conditions under which it was received; except that no gift to the research corporation shall be accepted unless approved [ereconfirmed] by the board of directors[-] as a gift that is beneficial to the research corporation's business of research, training of research personnel, and publication of research findings.

1		Notwithstanding the foregoing, the research
2		corporation may receive gifts, grants, or awards from
3		any agency or instrumentality of the United States, a
4		foreign nation, a state, a territory, or a possession
5		or from any political subdivision thereof, whenever
6		the donating or granting agency or instrumentality
7		determines and documents that the university or any
8		other agency of the State cannot [as effectively and
9		efficiently] accomplish the purposes for which the
10		gifts, grants, or awards are being made, except that
11		no gift to the research corporation shall be accepted
12		unless approved [or confirmed] by the board of
13		directors[+] as a gift that is beneficial to the
14		research corporation's business of research, training
15		of research personnel, and publication of research
16		findings;

14		publication of research findings may be accomplished
15		through whatever person, company, or agency is deemed
16		most appropriate by the board of directors; [and]

18		research and training; provided that minor projects
19		shall not exceed \$2 million in cost; and

3	(b) For the purposes of this section, "research personnel"
4	means any individual who is classified by the university or the
5	hiring entity as a research worker, spends the majority of work
6	hours engaged in the conduct of research, and receives
7	compensation as a research worker."
8	SECTION 5. Section 304A-3005, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
9	amended to read as follows:
10	"§304A-3005 Research corporation excepted from certain
11	state laws. (a) To carry out the purposes [and objectives] of
12	the research corporation[, including the conduct of research and
13	training projects, set forth in section 304A-3001, the research
14	corporation shall be granted flexibility in the hiring of its
15	personnel and [in] the handling and [disbursing] disbursement of
16	moneys by being excepted from the following state laws:
17	(1) Sections 36-27 and 36-30, relating to special fund
18	reimbursements to the state general fund;
19	(2) Chapter 103D, relating to advertising for bids and
20	purchases to be made in Hawaii whenever public moneys
21	are expended; provided that the exception shall not

1		apply to bids and purchases of goods and services that
2		are not used for research, training of research
3		personnel, or publication of research findings;
4	[ <del>(3)</del> -	Chapter 103D with respect to construction contracts;
5		provided that the exception shall not apply where
6		state funds are used and compliance with chapter 103D
7		is required by a bill enacted by the legislature;
8	<del>(4)</del> ]	(3) Chapter 76, relating to civil service; and
9	[ <del>-(5)</del> -]	(4) Section 78-1, relating to public employment.
10	(b)	For the purposes of this section, "research personnel"
11	means any	individual who is classified by the university or the
12	hiring en	tity as a research worker, spends the majority of work
13	hours eng	aged in the conduct of research, and receives
14	compensat	ion as a research worker."
15	SECT	ION 6. Section 304A-3010, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
16	amended to	o read as follows:
17	"[+]	§304A-3010[] Special account[.]; revolving accounts;
18	internal	service orders. (a) Notwithstanding any other law to
19	the contr	ary, the research corporation shall be authorized to
20	set up a	special account for depositing moneys received from
21	either pu	blic or private contracts, or from private or public

- 1 grants, awards, or gifts. The provisions of section [4]304A-
- 2 2003[+] and other laws to the contrary notwithstanding, this
- 3 special account may be used to receive, disburse, and account
- 4 for funds of research and training projects of the University of
- 5 Hawaii, other state agencies, and political subdivisions of the
- 6 State. All disbursements shall be drawn on the special account
- 7 upon checks prepared and signed, as approved by the executive
- 8 director and some other person authorized by the board of
- 9 directors.
- 10 (b) Any revolving accounts held by the research
- 11 corporation shall follow all laws governing the body and
- 12 policies set forth by the corporation. The research corporation
- 13 shall also follow Administrative Procedures 12.204, relating to
- 14 the guidelines and procedures for revolving fund service orders
- 15 to the research corporation.
- 16 (c) All internal service orders and revolving accounts of
- 17 the research corporation that involve the usage of University of
- 18 Hawaii intramural funds shall be reported to the legislature for
- 19 financial and mission compliance according to University of
- 20 Hawaii and research corporation policies on a biannual basis.

- 1 The University of Hawaii and the research corporation shall
- 2 review and approve all revolving accounts on an annual basis."
- 3 SECTION 7. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 4 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 5 SECTION 8. If any provision of this Act, or the
- 6 application thereof to any person or circumstance, is held
- 7 invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or
- 8 applications of the Act that can be given effect without the
- 9 invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions
- 10 of this Act are severable.
- 11 SECTION 9. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2022;
- 12 provided that the amendments made to section 304A-3003, Hawaii
- 13 Revised Statutes, by section 4 of this Act shall apply only to
- 14 contracts entered into by the research corporation of the
- 15 University of Hawaii after June 30, 2022.

## Report Title:

Research Corporation of the University of Hawaii; Purpose; Powers; Exemptions; Contract for Service

## Description:

Clarifies that the purpose of the Research Corporation of the University of Hawaii is to promote educational, scientific, and literary pursuits through research, training of research personnel, and dissemination of knowledge by publication of research findings; and its undertakings shall be limited to acts that are reasonably necessary to carry out this purpose. Requires revolving accounts to follow Corporation policies. Grandfathers existing Research Corporation of the University of Hawaii contracts and requires new contracts be subject to new limitations following enactment of this measure. Defines minor renovation projects permissible in support of research and training. Requires quarterly and annual reports to the Legislature for programs and civil servants utilized in Research Corporation of the University of Hawaii programs. Requires biannual reports to the Legislature regarding internal service orders and revolving accounts of the Research Corporation of the University of Hawaii that utilize University of Hawaii intramural funds for financial and mission compliance. Authorizes the Research Corporation of the University of Hawaii to conduct minor renovation projects at costs of \$2 million or less. (SD1)
