A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HOMESTEAD EXEMPTIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the coronavirus
- 2 disease 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic and governmental responses to
- 3 contain the spread of COVID-19 have precipitated an economic
- 4 contraction on a global, national, and local scale. In Hawaii,
- 5 this economic contraction ballooned the State's unemployed
- 6 population from its 2019 level of 2.8 per cent to its peak level
- 7 of 23.8 per cent in May 2020. Additionally, nearly half of the
- 8 households in the State have seen a decline in income due to the
- 9 COVID-19 pandemic. This economic contraction has exacerbated
- 10 the economic strain felt by Hawaii families due to the State's
- 11 high cost of living. The percentage of persons who are not
- 12 current on their mortgage loans more than doubled from 2019 to
- 13 2020. This will likely lead to a surge of foreclosures in the
- 14 State.
- 15 The legislature further finds that the amount of the
- 16 homestead exemption in the State has not been adjusted since

- 1 1978; meanwhile, \$1 in 1978 had the same buying power of more
- 2 than \$4 in 2020.
- 3 The purpose of this Act is to require the legislative
- 4 reference bureau to conduct a study to determine the appropriate
- 5 amount of an increase to the homestead exemption.
- 6 SECTION 2. (a) The legislative reference bureau shall
- 7 conduct a study to determine the appropriate amount of an
- 8 increase to the homestead exemption under the United States
- 9 Bankruptcy Code.
- 10 (b) The study shall examine the State's real property
- 11 exemption for a person's principal residence in bankruptcy
- 12 proceedings, pursuant to section 651-92, Hawaii Revised
- 13 Statutes, and shall include the following:
- 14 (1) A breakdown and comparison of real property and
- 15 homestead exemptions in states similar in size to the
- 16 State or with a similar tax structure;
- 17 (2) A comparison of how real property and homestead
- exemptions are applied in other states, comparing
- their similarities and differences to the State's
- 20 homestead exemption;

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1	(3)	Any fiscal implications to the State, counties, and
2		private sectors as a result of an increased homestead
3		exemption; and
4	(4)	An assessment of the number and frequency of claims
5		for the homestead exemption in the State.
6	(c)	In conducting the study, the legislative reference
7	bureau may seek input from any individual or entity the	
8	legislative reference bureau deems necessary to complete the	
9	study.	
10	(d)	The legislative reference bureau shall submit a repor-
11	of its fi	ndings and recommendations, including any proposed
12	legislati	on, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior
13	to the convening of the regular session of 2023.

Legislative Reference Bureau; Study; Homestead Exemption; Bankruptcy Proceedings

Description:

Requires the Legislative Reference Bureau to conduct a study to determine an appropriate increase to the homestead exemption in bankruptcy proceedings.

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
