A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO RECREATIONAL BOATING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 200, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is				
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated				
3	and to read as follows:				
4	"§200- Recreational use zones; non-traditional ocean				
5	recreation equipment; commercial harbors. (a) The department				
6	shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91 to designate				
7	recreational use zones where, and time periods during which,				
8	non-traditional ocean recreation equipment may be used in				
9	nearshore waters.				
10	(b) No person shall use non-traditional ocean recreation				
11	equipment in the nearshore waters of the State, except:				
12	(1) In recreational use zones and during time periods				
13	designated by the department;				
14	(2) Authorized government personnel conducting operations				
15	approved by the department;				
16	(3) Authorized permit holders conducting operations				
17	approved by the department; or				

1	(4) When used to conduct ocean cleanup, as authorized by
2	rules adopted by the department.
3	(c) The department shall establish non-traditional ocean
4	recreation equipment use fees which shall be deposited into the
5	boating special fund.
6	(d) The department shall enter into a memorandum of
7	agreement with the department of transportation to enforce
8	regulation of recreational use zones in commercial harbors or
9	portions of commercial harbors.
10	(e) For purposes of this section, "non-traditional ocean
11	recreation equipment" means ocean recreation equipment and
12	vessels that are not traditional to Hawaii, including but not
13	limited to sailboards, paraglides, kayaks, jet skis, foils, and
14	any motorized equipment or vessels. "Non-traditional ocean
15	recreation equipment" excludes surfboards and outrigger canoes.
16	SECTION 2. Section 199-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
17	amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
18	"(a) The conservation and resources enforcement officers,
19	with respect to all state lands, including public lands, state
20	parks, forest reserves, forests, aquatic life and wildlife

1	areas, Kal	hoolawe island reserve, and any other lands and waters
2	within the	e State, shall:
3	(1)	Enforce title 12, chapters 6D, 6E, and 6K, and rules
4		adopted thereunder;
5	(2)	Investigate complaints, gather evidence, conduct
6		investigations, and conduct field observations and
7		inspections as required or assigned;
8	(3)	Cooperate with enforcement authorities of the State,
9		counties, and federal government in development of
10		programs and mutual aid agreements for conservation
11		and resources enforcement activities within the State;
12	(4)	Cooperate with established search and rescue agencies
13		of the counties and the federal government in
14		developing plans and programs and mutual aid
15		agreements for search and rescue activities within the
16		State;
17	(5)	Check and verify all leases, permits, and licenses
18		issued by the department of land and natural
19		resources;
20	(6)	Enforce the laws relating to firearms, ammunition, and

dangerous weapons contained in chapter 134;

1	(7)	Enforce the laws in chapter 291E relating to operating
2		a vessel on or in the waters of the State while using
3		intoxicants;
4	(8)	Enforce the laws in chapter 200 relating to
5		recreational use zones in nearshore waters;
6	[(8)]	(9) Whether through a specifically designated marine
7		patrol or otherwise, enforce the rules in the areas of
8		boating safety, conservation, and search and rescue
9		relative to the control and management of boating
10		facilities owned or controlled by the State, ocean
11		waters, and navigable streams and any activities
12		thereon or therein, and beaches encumbered with
13		easements in favor of the public, and the rules
14		regulating vessels and their use in the waters of the
15		State; and
16	[(9)]	(10) Carry out other duties and responsibilities as
17		the board of land and natural resources from time to
18		time may direct."
19	SECT	ION 3. Section 200-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
20	amended to	o read as follows:

1	"§20	0-3 Ocean recreation and coastal areas programs. The
2	board sha	ll assume the following functions of the department of
3	transport	ation:
4	(1)	Managing and administering the ocean-based recreation
5		and coastal areas programs of the State;
6	(2)	Planning, developing, operating, administering, and
7		maintaining small boat harbors, launching ramps, and
8		other boating facilities and associated aids to
9		navigation throughout the State;
10	(3)	Developing and administering an ocean recreation
11		management plan;
12	(4)	Administering and operating a vessel registration
13		system for the State;
14	(5)	Regulating the commercial use of state waters and
15		marine resources, including operations originating
16		from private marinas;
17	(6)	Regulating boat regattas and other ocean water events;
18	(7)	Administering a marine casualty and investigation
19		program;
20	(8)	Assisting in abating air, water, and noise pollution;
21	(9)	Conducting public education in boating safety.

1	(10)	Administering the boating special lund;
2	(11)	Assisting in controlling shoreline erosion;
3	(12)	Repairing seawalls and other existing coastal
4		protective structures under the jurisdiction of the
5		State; [and]
6	(13)	Regulating recreational use zones in nearshore waters;
7		and
8	[(13)]	(14) Removing nonnatural obstructions and public
9		safety hazards from the shoreline, navigable streams,
10		harbors, channels, and coastal areas of the State."
11	SECT	ION 4. Section 200-8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
12	amended t	o read as follows:
13	" §20	0-8 Boating program; payment of costs. The cost of
14	administe	ring a comprehensive statewide boating program,
15	including	but not limited to the cost of:
16	(1)	Operating, maintaining, and managing all boating
17		facilities under the control of the department;
18	(2)	Improving boating safety;
19	(3)	Operating a vessel registration and boating casualty
20		investigation and reporting system;
21	(4)	Other boating program activities; [and]

1	(5)	Regulating	recreational	use	zones	in	nearshore	waters;
2		and						

(6) Planning, developing, managing, operating, or
maintaining of all lands and improvements under the
control and management of the board, including but not
limited to permanent or temporary staff positions who
may be appointed without regard to chapter 76, shall
be paid from the boating special fund; provided that
any fees collected within small boat harbors shall be
expended only for costs related to the operation,
upkeep, maintenance, and improvement of the small boat
harbors. The amortization (principal and interest) of
the costs of capital improvements for boating
facilities appropriated after July 1, 1975, including
but not limited to berths, slips, ramps, related
accommodations, general navigation channels,
breakwaters, aids to navigation, and other harbor
structures, may be paid from the boating special fund
or from general revenues as the legislature may
authorize in each situation. Revenues provided in
this chapter for the boating special fund shall be at

1	least sufficient to pay the special fund costs
2	established in this section."
3	SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general
4	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
5	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 for a
6	one-year pilot project at Kawaihae and Kahului harbors to
7	provide navigational devices, buoys, and other equipment to mark
8	recreational use zones for non-traditional ocean recreation
9	equipment in nearshore waters.
10	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
11	transportation for the purposes of this Act.
12	SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
13	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
14	SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2022.

Report Title:

Recreational Use Zones; Regulations; Department of Land and Natural Resources; Department of Transportation; Appropriation

Description:

Requires the Department of Land and Natural Resources to designate recreational use zones and establish fees for non-traditional ocean recreation equipment. Directs fees to be deposited into the boating special fund and authorizes the fund to be used for regulatory costs of recreational use zones. Requires the Department of Land and Natural Resources to enter into a memorandum of agreement with the Department of Transportation to regulate recreational use zones in commercial harbors. Appropriates funds for a one-year pilot project at Kawaihae and Kahului harbors to provide equipment to mark recreational use zones.
