A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO OFFENDER REENTRY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that offenders exiting
- 2 correctional facilities are at risk of becoming homeless but are
- 3 not privy to many services afforded to the homeless because they
- 4 are not considered "chronically homeless" for purposes of the
- 5 housing first programs pursuant to section 346-378, Hawaii
- 6 Revised Statutes. The purpose of this Act is to create a new
- 7 program called Project Reset, which will provide comprehensive
- 8 programs to assist inmates through the process of reentry,
- 9 rehabilitation, employment, and housing.
- 10 SECTION 2. There is established a project reset program,
- 11 to be administered by the governor's coordinator on homelessness
- 12 and to be administratively placed within the department of human
- 13 services. The purpose of the project reset program shall be to
- 14 oversee the development and implementation of comprehensive
- 15 post-release housing programs to assist offenders who are
- 16 transitioning back into the community. The program shall assist
- 17 offenders in securing post-release housing, including



- 1 transitional housing and permanent housing, as necessary, to
- 2 support the offender's reentry, rehabilitation, and employment
- 3 prospects.
- 4 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 5 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$375,000 or so much
- 6 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 for the
- 7 implementation and administration of the project reset program
- 8 established under this Act.
- 9 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 10 human services for the purposes of this Act.
- 11 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2022.
