A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO OFFENDER REENTRY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that offenders exiting
- 2 correctional facilities are at risk of becoming homeless but are
- 3 not eligible for many services afforded to the homeless because
- 4 the offenders are not considered "chronically homeless" for
- 5 purposes of the housing first programs implemented pursuant to
- 6 section 346-378, Hawaii Revised Statutes.
- 7 The purpose of this Act is to create a new program called
- 8 "project reset", which will provide comprehensive programs to
- 9 assist inmates through the process of reentry, rehabilitation,
- 10 and seeking employment and housing.
- 11 SECTION 2. There is established a project reset program,
- 12 to be administered by the governor's coordinator on homelessness
- 13 and to be administratively placed within the department of human
- 14 services. The purpose of the project reset program shall be to
- 15 oversee the development and implementation of comprehensive
- 16 post-release housing programs to assist offenders who are
- 17 transitioning back into the community. The program shall assist



- 1 offenders in securing post-release housing, including
- 2 transitional housing and permanent housing, as necessary, to
- 3 support offenders' reentry, rehabilitation, and employment
- 4 prospects.
- 5 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 6 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
- 7 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 for the
- 8 establishment, implementation, and administration of the project
- 9 reset program established under this Act.
- 10 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 11 human services for the purposes of this Act.
- 12 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
