A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PROCUREMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the procurement of
- 2 professional services under section 103D-304, Hawaii Revised
- 3 Statutes, currently requires a selection committee to rank a
- 4 minimum of three persons based on the selection criteria and
- 5 send the ranking to the head of the purchasing agency to begin
- 6 negotiations. This requirement was upheld in Asato v.
- 7 Procurement Policy Board, 322 P.3d 228 (Haw. 2014).
- 8 However, the legislature further finds that when an agency
- 9 seeks to procure professional services and does not receive the
- 10 requisite minimum of three responses, it must continue to re-
- 11 solicit, expending additional time and resources to fulfill the
- 12 solicitation. An exemption from the procurement approval
- 13 process would increase efficiency and facilitate the procurement
- 14 of specialized professional services by allowing procuring
- 15 agencies to timely procure needed professional services in
- 16 situations when there are fewer than three qualified
- 17 submissions.



- 1 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to allow agencies
- 2 procuring professional services to submit a request for an
- 3 exemption from the procurement process from the chief
- 4 procurement officer if fewer than three qualified persons
- 5 respond to a solicitation.
- 6 SECTION 2. Section 103D-304, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 7 amended as follows:
- 8 1. By amending subsection (g) to read:
- 9 "(g) The selection committee shall rank a minimum of three
- 10 persons based on the selection criteria and send the ranking to
- 11 the head of the purchasing agency. If fewer than three
- 12 qualified persons respond to a solicitation, the agency may
- 13 submit a request for exemption from the chief procurement
- 14 officer pursuant to section 103D-102(b)(4)(L). The contract
- 15 file shall contain a copy of the summary of qualifications for
- 16 the ranking of each of the persons provided to the head of the
- 17 purchasing agency for contract negotiations. If more than one
- 18 person holds the same qualifications under this section, the
- 19 selection committee shall rank the persons in a manner that
- 20 ensures equal distribution of contracts among the persons

- 1 holding the same qualifications. The recommendations of the
- 2 selection committee shall not be overturned without due cause."
- 3 2. By amending subsection (j) to read:
- 4 "(j) Contracts for professional services [of less than]
- 5 within the limits in section $103D-305[\tau]$ may be negotiated by
- 6 the head of the purchasing agency, or designee, with at least
- 7 any two persons on the list of qualified persons established
- 8 pursuant to subsection (c). Negotiations shall be conducted in
- 9 the manner set forth in subsection (h), with ranking based on
- 10 the selection criteria of subsection (e) as determined by the
- 11 head of the agency."
- 12 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 13 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 14 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
