A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PROCUREMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- ${f 1}$ SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the procurement of
- 2 professional services under section 103D-304, Hawaii Revised
- 3 Statutes, currently requires a selection committee to rank a
- 4 minimum of three persons based on the selection criteria and
- 5 send the ranking to the head of the purchasing agency to begin
- 6 negotiations. This requirement was upheld in Asato v.
- 7 Procurement Policy Board, 322 P.3d 228 (Haw. S. Ct. 2014).
- 8 However, the legislature further finds that when an agency
- 9 seeks to procure professional services and does not receive the
- 10 requisite minimum of three responses, it must continue to re-
- 11 solicit, expending additional time and resources to fulfill the
- 12 solicitation. An alternate procurement approval process would
- 13 increase efficiency and facilitate the procurement of
- 14 specialized professional services by allowing procuring agencies
- 15 to timely procure needed professional services in situations
- 16 where the agency receives less than three bids or proposals from
- 17 qualified persons.



- 1 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to allow agencies
- 2 procuring professional services to request an exemption from
- 3 chapter 103D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, if fewer than three
- 4 qualified persons submit statements of qualifications.
- 5 SECTION 2. Section 103D-304, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 6 amended as follows:
- 7 1. By amending subsection (g) to read:
- 8 "(g) The selection committee shall rank a minimum of three
- 9 persons based on the selection criteria and send the ranking to
- 10 the head of the purchasing agency [-] The contract file shall
- 11 contain a copy of the summary of qualifications for the ranking
- 12 of each of the persons provided to the head of the purchasing
- 13 agency for contract negotiations. If more than one person holds
- 14 the same qualifications under this section, the selection
- 15 committee shall rank the persons in a manner that ensures equal
- 16 distribution of contracts among the persons holding the same
- 17 qualifications. The recommendations of the selection committee
- 18 shall not be overturned without due cause.
- 19 If fewer than three persons submit statements of
- 20 qualifications, the agency may make a request for an exemption
- 21 pursuant to section 103D-102(b)(4)(L)."

- 1 2. By amending subsection (j) to read:
- "(j) Contracts for professional services [of less than]
- 3 within the limits in section $103D-305[\tau]$ may be negotiated by
- 4 the head of the purchasing agency, or designee, with at least
- 5 any two persons on the list of qualified persons established
- 6 pursuant to subsection (c). Negotiations shall be conducted in
- 7 the manner set forth in subsection (h), with ranking based on
- 8 the selection criteria of subsection (e) as determined by the
- 9 head of the agency."
- 10 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 11 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 12 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
