# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CHILD CUSTODY.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the family court may
- 2 appoint a child custody evaluator from a list of qualified
- 3 individuals to investigate a child custody dispute. State law
- 4 currently prefers that licensed psychiatrists, psychologists,
- 5 marriage and family therapists, and social workers serve as
- 6 evaluators, but authorizes individuals with qualifying education
- 7 and training in child custody evaluations to serve as evaluators
- 8 when licensed psychiatrists, psychologists, marriage and family
- 9 therapists, or social workers are not available. The law also
- 10 authorizes other individuals, known as fact-finding
- 11 investigators, to serve as child custody evaluators by
- 12 stipulation of the parties and approval by the court. These
- 13 evaluators are most often attorneys who practice family law.
- 14 The legislature also finds that child custody evaluators
- 15 typically provide written reports to the court, and sometimes
- 16 testify at hearings or at trial.

1	The legislature believes that professionals who work before
2	the family court and who have an impact on the safety and
3	well-being of children and families need to understand the
4	dynamics of domestic violence. When child custody evaluators do
5	not have in-depth training and education on domestic violence,
6	their recommendations to the courts on custody matters may be
7	unduly affected and may not serve the best interests of
8	children. The legislature recognizes that domestic violence is
9	often not identified at the outset of a custody case and is
10	often not the reason for an evaluation. Accordingly, knowledge
11	about domestic violence issues, including lethality, subtlety,
12	and prevalence of domestic violence, is essential for child
13	custody evaluators.
14	The purpose of this Act is to:
15	(1) Require certain individuals who wish to act or
16	continue acting as child custody evaluators to
17	complete a training course on domestic violence issues
18	every three years; and
19	(2) Establish requirements for the training course and
20	submitting or providing proof of completion.

14	(b)	A person may be appointed as a child custody evaluator
15	in the ab	sence of a license under subsection (a) if:
16	(1)	The individual has obtained education and training
17		that meet nationally recognized competencies and
18		standards of practice in child custody evaluation;
19		provided that there are no child custody evaluators
20		enumerated under subsection (a) who are willing and

1		available, within a reasonable period of time, to
2		perform child custody evaluations; or
3	(2)	The parties stipulate to a person who does not qualify
4		as a child custody evaluator under subsection (a) and
5		the court approves, subject to subsection (c), that
6		person as a fact-finding investigator to the court.
7	<u>(c)</u>	Beginning July 1, 2023, a person described in
8	subsectio	ns (a) or (b)(2) who wishes to act or continue acting
9	as a chil	d custody evaluator pursuant to this section shall
10	complete	a training course on domestic violence issues every
11	three yea	rs. The training course shall be one that is developed
12	and facil	itated by a domestic violence program based in Hawaii.
13	The perso	n shall submit a letter or certificate of completion to
14	the famil	y court and, upon request, shall provide copies thereof
15	to all pa	rties or to the parties' attorneys. All persons on the
16	family co	urt's registry as of July 1, 2023, shall provide proof
17	of comple	tion of the training course on or before June 1, 2025.
18	[ <del>-(c)</del>	d The judiciary shall maintain on its website a
19	publicly	accessible registry of child custody evaluators who are
20	qualified	pursuant to this section. Professionals who are
21	willing a	nd available to perform child custody evaluations shall

- 1 be responsible for providing the judiciary with relevant
- 2 information, including contact information, evidence of
- 3 qualifications, and fees.
- 4 [<del>(d)</del>] <u>(e)</u> The judiciary shall establish a referral process
- 5 to allow parties to file a complaint with the judiciary
- 6 regarding a court-appointed child custody evaluator. Upon
- 7 notification by a party of the party's intent to file a
- 8 complaint against a child custody evaluator appointed under
- 9 subsection (a), the judiciary may refer the complainant to the
- 10 appropriate licensing authority. The judiciary shall submit to
- 11 the legislature an annual report regarding the number of
- 12 complaints against court-appointed child custody evaluators that
- 13 are processed through the referral process.
- 14 [(e)] (f) A complaint against a court-appointed child
- 15 custody evaluator not qualified under subsection (a) may be
- 16 resolved through civil litigation."
- 17 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 18 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$35,000 or so much
- 19 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 for the
- 20 development of the training course on domestic violence issues

- 1 required by section 2 of this Act, including development of the
- 2 course curriculum and facilitation of the training process.
- 3 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the judiciary for
- 4 the purposes of this Act; provided that the judiciary may
- 5 contract with a nonprofit organization to develop the course
- 6 curriculum and facilitate the training process.
- 7 SECTION 4. The appropriation made by this Act for fiscal
- 8 year 2022-2023 for the judiciary shall not lapse at the end of
- 9 the fiscal year for which the appropriation is made; provided
- 10 that all moneys from the appropriation that are unencumbered as
- 11 of June 30, 2024, shall lapse as of that date.
- 12 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 13 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 14 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2060.
