A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HISTORIC PRESERVATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 6E, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
2 by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to
3 read as follows:

4 "§6E- President Barack Obama markers. (a) The
5 department shall place historical markers in the State to
6 indicate significant sites in the life of President Barack
7 Obama, the forty-fourth President of the United States of
8 America.

9 (b) The sites shall include but are not limited to:

10 (1) 6085 Kalaniana'ole highway;

11 (2) Baskin-Robbins on King street;

12 (3) Island Snow Hawaii;

13 (4) Kapiolani Medical Center for Women and Children;

14 (5) Koko Crater trail;

15 (6) Noelani elementary school;

16 (7) Punahou Circle Apartments;

17 (8) Punahou School; and



1 (9) Sandy beach;
 2 provided that the private businesses agree to have the marker
 3 placed at the business or, if a private business does not agree,
 4 that the marker shall be placed on public property nearest to
 5 the site."

6 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
 7 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
 8 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 for
 9 the department of land and natural resources to place historical
 10 markers in the State to indicate significant sites in the life
 11 of President Barack Obama.

12 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the state
 13 historic preservation division of the department of land and
 14 natural resources for the purposes of this Act.

15 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.

16 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2022.
