A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION FUNDING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the Reinventing
- 2 Education Act of 2004 (Act 51, Session Laws of Hawaii 2004)
- 3 established a weighted student formula to allocate moneys to
- 4 schools according to the different costs of educating students
- 5 with different needs.
- 6 The legislature further finds that despite the intended
- 7 equitable distribution of funds, the weighted student formula
- 8 has placed small and remote schools at a disadvantage. In the
- 9 case of Hana high and elementary school, for example, the
- 10 budgetary shortfall has resulted in the loss of several well-
- 11 qualified teachers and has threatened the school's ability to
- 12 offer minimum course requirements for students to earn high
- 13 school diplomas. As of 2005, six schools were excepted from
- 14 weighted student formula allocations.
- 15 The legislature additionally finds that small and remote
- 16 schools should be adequately funded to retain the minimal
- 17 personnel and resources necessary to deliver a quality education

- 1 to students. Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to improve
- 2 the fiscal equity for small and remote schools by requiring the
- 3 department of education's committee on weights to consider any
- 4 inequities of negative consequences of its weighted student
- 5 formula on small and remote schools.
- 6 SECTION 2. Section 302A-1303.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes,
- 7 is amended to read as follows:
- 8 "§302A-1303.5 Committee on weights. (a) There is
- 9 established within the department of education the committee on
- 10 weights to develop a weighted student formula pursuant to
- 11 section 302A-1303.6. The committee [may:] shall:
- (1) Create a list of student characteristics that will be
- weighted;
- 14 (2) Create a system of weights based upon the student
- characteristics that may be applied to determine the
- relative cost of educating any student;
- 17 (3) Determine specific student weights, including their
- 18 unit value;
- 19 (4) Determine which moneys shall be included in the amount
- of funds to be allocated through the weighted student
- 21 formula;

1	(5)	Recommend a weighted student formula to the board of
2		education;
3	(6)	Perform any other function that may facilitate the
4		implementation of the weighted student formula; and
5	(7)	Meet not less than once every odd-numbered year, to
6		review the weighted student formula and, if the
7		committee deems it necessary, recommend a new weighted
8		student formula for adoption by the board of
9		education[-];
10	provided	that the committee, when developing its weighted
11	student f	ormula recommendations, shall consider any inequities
12	or negati	ve consequences of its weighted student formula funding
13	recommend	ations on small and remote schools, report these
14	inequitie	s or negative consequences to the board, and provide
15	funding a	djustment recommendations to ameliorate these
16	inequitie	s or negative consequences.
17	(b)	For the purposes of subsection (a), "small and remote
18	school" m	eans a public school except for a public school
19	governed	by chapter 302D, that is:
20	(1)	Located at least a one-hour drive away from the
21		nearest public high school;

1	(2) Located on the islands of Lanai, Molokai, or Niihau;	
2	(3) An elementary school with a student enrollment of less	
3	than two hundred students; or	
4	(4) A secondary school with a student enrollment of less	
5	than four hundred students.	
6	[-(b)] (c) The composition of the committee on weights	
7	shall be determined by the board of education based on	
8	recommendations from the superintendent of education and dean of	
9	the University of Hawaii at Manoa college of education and	
10	include principals, teachers, and other members with the	
11	appropriate professional skills, experiences, and qualifications	
12	needed to facilitate the work of the committee. The	
13	superintendent or the superintendent's designee shall chair the	
14	committee on weights.	
15	[(c)] <u>(d)</u> The committee on weights may form advisory	
16	subcommittees to obtain input from key stakeholders as	
17	determined necessary by the committee.	
18	$[\frac{(d)}{(e)}]$ The members of the committee on weights shall	
19	serve at the pleasure of the board of education and shall not be	
20	subject to section 26-34. Members of the committee on weights	
21	shall serve without compensation but shall be reimbursed for	

- 1 expenses, including travel expenses, necessary for the
- performance of their duties."
- 3 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 4 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 5 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
