A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ACCESS TO BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that emergency
- 2 governmental proclamations to restrict and manage in-person
- 3 gatherings and meetings during the coronavirus disease 2019
- 4 (COVID-19) pandemic have suspended certain laws that exclude the
- 5 use of standard telephone contacts from the definition of
- 6 "telehealth" to enable health care providers and patients to
- 7 minimize in-person meetings while also ensure access to care.
- 8 The availability of insurance reimbursement for telehealth
- 9 provided through standard telephone contacts has greatly
- 10 increased access to care for vulnerable populations, including
- 11 the elderly, low-income, medically- and socially-complex
- 12 patients, and those in rural areas who do not have the broadband
- 13 capabilities, electronic equipment, financial means,
- 14 transportation options, or technological proficiency to operate
- 15 sophisticated digital video conferencing software. Allowing
- 16 standard telephone contacts to qualify as "telehealth" also



- 1 avoids problems with devices, internet, sufficient bandwidth,
- 2 power and battery charging capabilities, and digital literacy.
- 3 The legislature further finds that the prolonged nature of
- 4 the public health emergency created by COVID-19 and its
- 5 attendant personal, familial, work, social, and economic
- 6 disruptions have created chronic and unprecedented emotional
- 7 distress, anxiety, and mental conditions for all of Hawaii's
- 8 communities. The demand for mental health services has never
- 9 been so high.
- 10 Research has found standard telephone contacts to be an
- 11 effective, viable means for providing timely mental health
- 12 services to patients. Talk therapy and other audio-only
- 13 treatment modalities do not require physical examinations or
- 14 medical prescriptions. As recently noted by the Hawaii
- 15 department of human services in testimony submitted in support
- 16 of a similar measure (which was broadly and enthusiastically
- 17 supported by the medical community with the exception of the
- 18 health insurance companies), "telephone calls have been shown to
- 19 be clinically effective for some services such as behavioral
- 20 health." Moreover, standard telephone contacts for telehealth

- 1 purposes is endorsed nationally by the American Psychological
- 2 Association.
- 3 Therefore, the purpose of this Act is to allow for the use
- 4 and reimbursement of standard telephone contacts for telehealth
- 5 purposes by mental health professionals.
- 6 SECTION 2. Section 346-59.1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 7 amended by amending subsection (g) to read as follows:
- 8 "(q) For the purposes of this section:
- 9 "Distant site" means the location of the health care
- 10 provider delivering services through telehealth at the time the
- 11 services are provided.
- 12 "Health care provider" means a provider of services, as
- 13 defined in title 42 United States Code section 1395x(u), a
- 14 provider of medical and other health services, as defined in
- 15 title 42 United States Code section 1395x(s), other
- 16 practitioners licensed by the State and working within their
- 17 scope of practice, and any other person or organization who
- 18 furnishes, bills, or is paid for health care in the normal
- 19 course of business, including but not limited to primary care
- 20 providers, mental health providers, oral health providers,
- 21 physicians and osteopathic physicians licensed under chapter

- 1 453, advanced practice registered nurses licensed under chapter
- 2 457, psychologists licensed under chapter 465, and dentists
- 3 licensed under chapter 448.
- 4 "Originating site" means the location where the patient is
- 5 located, whether accompanied or not by a health care provider,
- 6 at the time services are provided by a health care provider
- 7 through telehealth, including but not limited to a health care
- 8 provider's office, hospital, critical access hospital, rural
- 9 health clinic, federally qualified health center, a patient's
- 10 home, and other non-medical environments such as school-based
- 11 health centers, university-based health centers, or the work
- 12 location of a patient.
- "Telehealth" means the use of telecommunications services,
- 14 as defined in section 269-1, to encompass four modalities:
- 15 store and forward technologies, remote monitoring, live
- 16 consultation, and mobile health; and which shall include but not
- 17 be limited to real-time video conferencing-based communication,
- 18 secure interactive and non-interactive web-based communication,
- 19 and secure asynchronous information exchange, to transmit
- 20 patient medical information, including diagnostic-quality
- 21 digital images and laboratory results for medical interpretation

- 1 and diagnosis, for the purpose of delivering enhanced health
- 2 care services and information while a patient is at an
- 3 originating site and the health care provider is at a distant
- 4 site. Standard telephone contacts, facsimile transmissions, or
- 5 e-mail text, in combination or by itself, does not constitute a
- 6 telehealth service for the purposes of this section [-], except
- 7 for behavioral health services pursuant to section 453-1.3(h)."
- 8 SECTION 3. Section 431:10A-116.3, Hawaii Revised Statutes,
- 9 is amended by amending subsection (g) to read as follows:
- "(g) For the purposes of this section:
- 11 "Distant site" means the location of the health care
- 12 provider delivering services through telehealth at the time the
- 13 services are provided.
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- 6 e-mail text, in combination or by itself, does not constitute a
- 7 telehealth service for the purposes of this chapter [-], except
- 8 for behavioral health services pursuant to section 453-1.3(h)."
- 9 SECTION 4. Section 432:1-601.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes,
- 10 is amended by amending subsection (g) to read as follows:
- "(g) For the purposes of this section:
- 12 "Health care provider" means a provider of services, as
- defined in title 42 United States Code section 1395x(u), a
- 14 provider of medical and other health services, as defined in
- 15 title 42 United States Code section 1395x(s), other
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- 3 site. Standard telephone contacts, facsimile transmissions, or
- 4 e-mail text, in combination or by itself, does not constitute a
- 5 telehealth service for the purposes of this chapter [-], except
- 6 for behavioral health services pursuant to section 453-1.3(h)."
- 7 SECTION 5. Section 432D-23.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 8 amended by amending subsection (g) to read as follows:
- 9 "(q) For the purposes of this section:
- 10 "Distant site" means the location of the health care
- 11 provider delivering services through telehealth at the time the
- 12 services are provided.
- "Health care provider" means a provider of services, as
- 14 defined in title 42 United States Code section 1395x(u), a
- 15 provider of medical and other health services, as defined in
- 16 title 42 United States Code section 1395x(s), other
- 17 practitioners licensed by the State and working within their
- 18 scope of practice, and any other person or organization who
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- 4 site. Standard telephone contacts, facsimile transmissions, or
- 5 e-mail text, in combination or by itself, does not constitute a
- 6 telehealth service for the purposes of this chapter [-], except
- 7 for behavioral health services pursuant to section 453-1.3(h)."
- 8 SECTION 6. Section 453-1.3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 9 amended by amending subsection (h) to read as follows:
- 10 "(h) Reimbursement for behavioral health services provided
- 11 through telehealth, including standard telephone contacts, shall
- 12 be equivalent to reimbursement for the same services provided
- 13 via face-to-face contact between a health care provider and a
- 14 patient."
- 15 SECTION 7. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 16 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 17 SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2050.
