## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO UNDERGROUND STORAGE TANKS.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. Chapter 342L, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

  amended by adding a new section to part II to be appropriately

  designated and to read as follows:
- 4 "§342L- Permits near a potable water aquifer prohibited;
- 5 exceptions (a) The department shall not issue a permit for a
- 6 new underground fuel storage tank located above or within
- 7 feet of a potable water aquifer; provided that a permit may be
- 8 issued by the department for purposes of repairing an existing
- 9 underground fuel storage tank.
- (b) Permits issued for an existing underground fuel
- 11 storage tank located above or within feet of a potable
- 12 water aquifer shall not be extended or renewed beginning
- 13 January 1, 2023.
- (c) Beginning January 1, 2030, the department shall not
- 15 authorize any variances pursuant to section 342L-5, for an
- 16 underground fuel storage tank located above or within feet
- of a potable water aquifer."

### Report Title:

Underground Storage Tanks; Regulations; Permits; Variances; Potable Water Aquifer; Sole Source Aquifers

### Description:

Prohibits the issuance of permits located above or within feet of a potable water aquifer; provided that a permit may be issued for purposes of repairing or replacing an existing underground fuel storage tank. Prohibits extensions or renewals of permits issued for such underground fuel storage tanks beginning January 1, 2023. Prohibits the authorization of variances for such underground fuel storage tanks beginning January 1, 2023. Accelerates the start date of the prohibition against the operation of an underground fuel storage tank within one hundred yards of the shoreline and the renewal of permits therefor from January 1, 2045, to January 1, 2030. Prohibits the operation or installation of an underground storage tank above a sole source aquifer.
